


2024 HOMELESS POINT-IN-TIME COUNT


The 2024 Point-in-Time (PIT) Count identified 471 more people experiencing homelessness on a given night since 2023.





SELF-REPORTED HEALTH CONDITIONS



METHODOLOGY

The 2024 PIT Count methodology followed the Housing and Urban Development's quidelines for a "night of" observational count followed by a random sample survey to gather demographic data and homeless experience.
