

## CITIZEN'S POLICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE Round Hill (P-5)

Alamo, California

Minutes of Meeting on October 21, 2025

<u>Committee Members in Attendance:</u> Jason Hill, Lee Mlejnek, Mark Cordone, Corey Berla, Jason Dudum

Committee Members Absent: Bernard Corey, Mark Young, Rich Johnson

<u>Guests in Attendance:</u> Lieutenant Dickerson, Deputy Shanks, Cameron Collins (Field Representative for the Supervisor's Office)

The P-5 Advisory Committee was held at Round Hill Country Club. Jason Hill called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM. The September Minutes were approved with no corrections.

Public Comment: none

<u>Financial Report:</u> Mark Young was not in attendance at the meeting but had included financial reports in the most recent email from Cameron Collins.

<u>P-5 Activity Report:</u> Deputy Shanks reported on three incidents in September including a domestic violence between a married couple and a grand theft from an unlocked vehicle.

Lieutenant Dickerson informed the Committee that there has been a surge in home burglaries in the San Ramon area and historically these surges can move north although Danville's statistics do not yet show increasing rates. As the holidays approach this trend could affect the P-5 jurisdiction. Mark Cordone requested that Lt. Dickerson and Deputy Shanks issue an official statement on the Sheriff's letterhead concerning this potential trend which Mark can distribute to Round Hill Property Owners to serve as a warning to all residents to remain

vigilant and safeguard their property and belongings. It was proposed that Corey Berla could convey a similar message to homeowners residing in Round Hill North Estates.

Lt. Dickerson advised the Committee that the Sheriff's office has engaged Peregrine which is an online searchable data base that will improve data reporting. He also advised the Committee that Deputy Shanks will be getting Radar and Lidar training early next year. The fee for this training will be \$529.00. Jason hill made a motion to use P-5 funds to cover the \$529.00 tuition. It was seconded by Jason Dudum and carried unanimously.

In September there were 105 hours of overtime primarily due to the absence of Deputy Smith. There were no hours of outside assistance.

Old Business: The single Alamo Police District issue is on hold until Supervisor Andersen meets with Sheriff Livingston for a sign off on the merger.

New Business: The Committee will soon be considering a meeting day change to better conform with the availability of space to meet at the Round Hill Country Club.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:38
