	Sargent	Meeting called to order at 6:37 pm.
Minutes to approve	Sargent	Pavlinec moved, Sapir seconded approval of August 21, 2024 minutes. Passed unanimously.
Treasurer's Report	Mills	\$2300 in Treasury, pending a few items from past Festival.
CA Highway Patrol	Sargent	No CHP officer present.
Contra Costa County Animal Services	Ben Winkelblack, Director	Director Winkelback, a Certified Animal Administrator, has been on the job for 5 months and gave his report in person. Basic facts about the department: • serving 7,000 animal/year • Average stay is 20 days. • Animals must be spayed/neutered to be able to adopt (state law) • Measure X funding will fund 2700 spay/neuter services in the next three years. • Animal Benefit Fund will fund 544 spay/neuter this year as well as community outreach. • July 5 is the busiest day • 3, 998 licenses in June, a 54% increase. Animal Services challenges are: • Down 5 field services officers. • Increasing animal intake. • Shelter is beyond capacity every day. • Medical costs went up 40%. • Veterinary costs have increased 100%. • Increased needs in community

		• Usually responding to 300 "holdover calls."
		 Animal Services is addressing these challenges by: Adding staff (see below.) Focusing on "pathway planning:" weekly meetings with partners to coordinate care of animals most in need. Rolling out barcode scanning to collect health data. Adding sound-deadening in the cat area. Planning to house dogs differently. Opening some of the kennels. Making a renewed focus on animal licensing, to meet rabies requirements. 37% return to home rate. Goal is 100%. Reopening "adoption galleries" in the back. A vet behaviorist has toured and made facility suggestions, i.e. different kinds of beds for dogs; different ways to feed dogs; new ways to lower stress in animals. There is a cat foster program. Possibly starting a "Barn Cat" program. Staffing changes being made are: 2 new officers have completed training and 4 more are in the training process. Chief of Shelter medicine is an open position and the Department has begun to recruit for. A dog foster program person has just been hired. No dedicated staff right now, for youth programs. (Some partners do "humane education.") Hiring an additional medical technician. Upcoming events include a microchip support event. In answer to audience questions he assured us: strays are not put in play groups; no, there is no longer a facility near Sugar City; he wants partners [i.e. Jelly's] to succeed.




Historic Historical Windows In East Richmond Heights



The stained glass windows were designed and built by Dr. John Wallis of the Wallis-Wiley Studio of Pasadena.

Wallis began working with stained glass in the 1920s.

Works include the windows at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine and the Riverside Church, both in New York City to The Cathedral of St. Andrew in Honolulu, Hawaii.



Locally, their work is found in Kensington, Orinda and Berkeley.




