

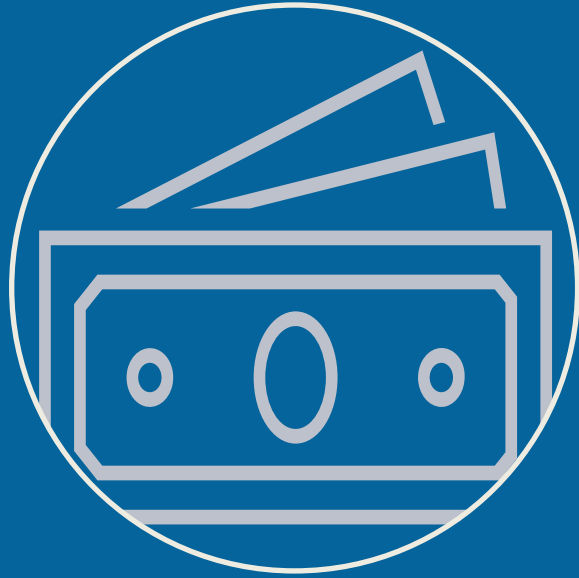

homelessness

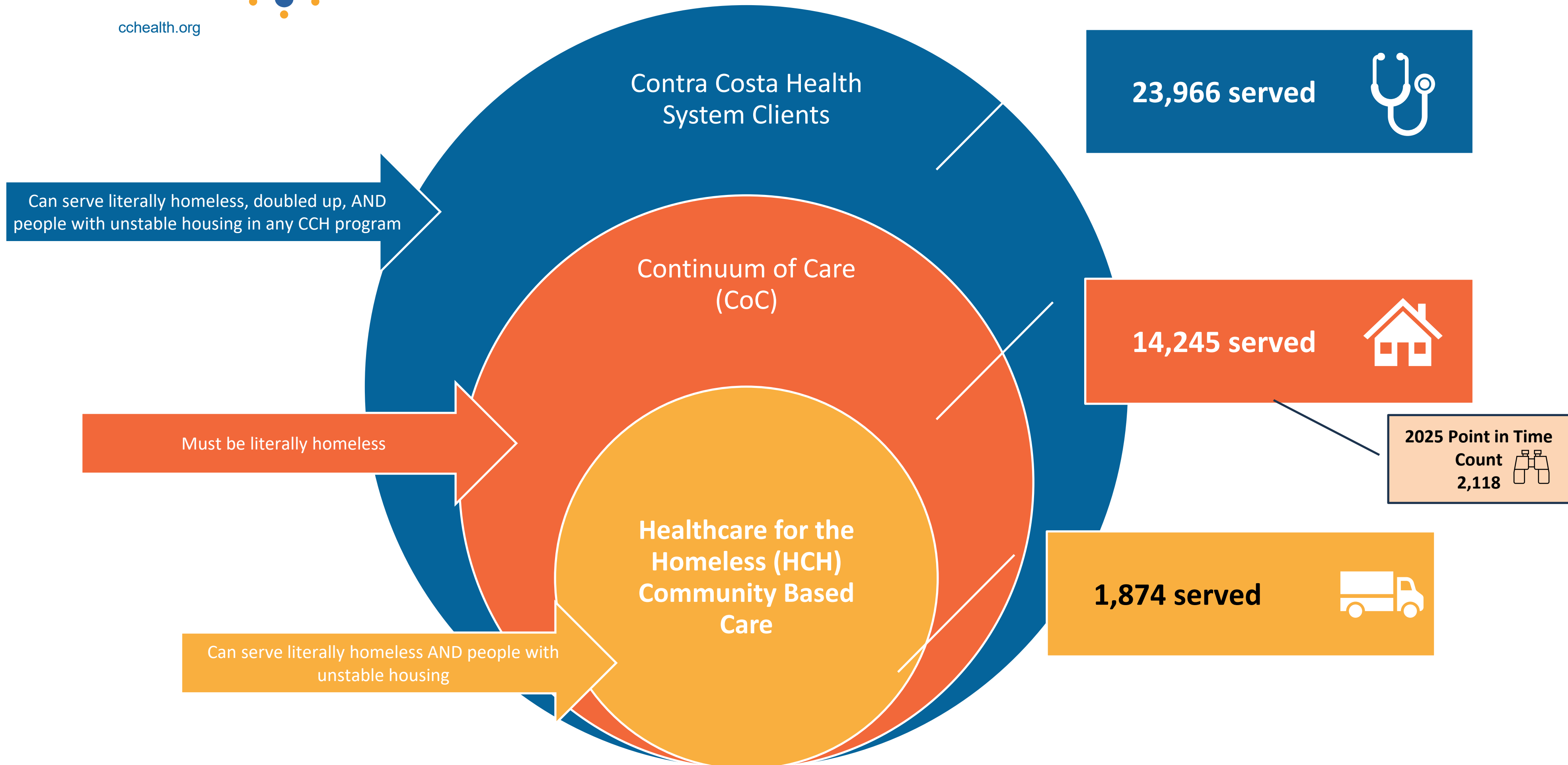


2,118 people experienced

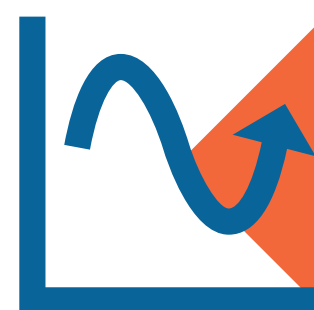

State budget cycles introduce uncertainty



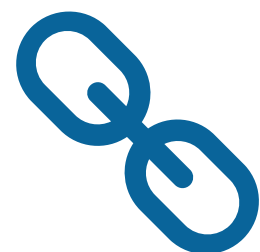
Local investments, like Measure X Housing Fund, are crucial to mitigating federal and state budget threats

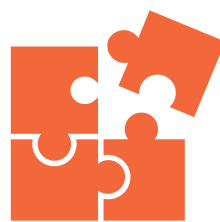
Impact of Catastrophic Cuts to Federal Funding



- At least 500 Contra Costa residents in permanent supportive housing and rapid rehousing could lose their homes next year



- Timing of the cuts creates an immediate crisis - HUD will not announce grant awards until May 2026, long past the expiration of some current grant agreements. This leaves service providers, landlords, and residents in limbo.



- Contra Costa Health is acting quickly to protect residents – coordinating with non-profits, County agencies, and stakeholders to identify non-CoC housing programs, services, and funding gaps to support residents at-risk of losing their housing
