3. Review and Approve Draft Record of Actions for April 14, 2026 meeting  
Linda Kralik - Motion, Robert Durr – Second: Motion Passed unanimously with members present.

4. Chief of Police Report – April '26

A. 610 Calls for Service: 6 Reports, 0 Felony, 2 Misdemeanor, 3 Arrests

Felonies:

-None

Misdemeanors:

- An intoxicated suspect was consuming an alcoholic beverage in the Plaza. Deputies responded and two individuals were subsequently arrested for public intoxication and obstructing/resisting a police officer. Both were booked at the Martinez Detention Facility.

- A Blackhawk Deputy responded to a single-vehicle rollover collision with the driver trapped inside, after a 911 call. CHP responded and assumed the investigation. The driver was arrested for suspicion of DUI after being removed from the vehicle.

B. Arrests – Three arrests listed above.

\*\* Other reports were supplemental and/or civil in nature.

### C. Incidents of Interest

- Intoxicated individuals included a brief foot pursuit (listed above). Some of the subjects were allowed to leave. The vehicle associated with the incident was towed. Additional patrols of the area are being made to deter unwanted loiterers and other public nuisances.

D. Volunteers in Policing: 15 hours served by four volunteers. All volunteers provided routine security checks and Vacation House Checks/extra patrol.

### E. Items of interest:

- With warm weather more pedestrians are walking and running in the community. Slow down, watch and yield for pedestrians, use extra caution in low-light periods, never pass a vehicle stopped at a crosswalk, check carefully when backing up.

- Additional conversations about e-bikes and e-scooters, regarding requirements and limitations, as well as how they are being altered. Bikes and scooters are prohibited on sidewalks in Danville.

### 5. C.H.P. Report

- 4500 calls, 230 crashes, 4 fatalities (680/84, east bound 580 Livermore, Vasco, & Tesla). Crash at Camino Tassajara & BH Drive – Driver ran the red light coming out of the gate and collided with a car on Camino Tassajara. Initiated conversations at the Supervisor's Office regarding safety of intersection. Possibly looking at a 1 second delay between red to green transition.

# Blackhawk Police Services

## Summary for April 2026

Blackhawk and Valley Station Deputies either initiated or responded to the following calls for service:

- 645 ~ Total calls for service in Blackhawk
- 6 ~ Total police reports were taken in Blackhawk

**Felonies** – There was 1 felony crimes reported in the District for a Domestic Disturbance.

- On May 1, 2026, deputies from Blackhawk and Valley Station responded to a reported domestic disturbance. Following an investigation and interviews with all involved parties, one individual was arrested on charges of child abuse and booked into the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Misdemeanors** – There was 1 misdemeanor reported in the district.

- On May 23, 2026, the Blackhawk Deputy responded to a reported lost property at the Blackhawk Plaza. The reporting party stated that she left her sunglasses on a counter and discovered they were missing when she returned. Staff members were unable to locate the sunglasses and did not recall seeing them left behind. The incident was ultimately classified as a petty theft. Currently, there are no known leads, witnesses or suspects.
- **Arrests** – There was 1 arrest in the district for the month.

## Incidents of Interest

- On May 14, 2026, at approximately 5:30 a.m., Blackhawk and Valley Station deputies, the California Highway Patrol (CHP), and San Ramon Valley Fire personnel responded to the 500 block of Buttonwood Drive for a reported injury traffic collision involving a vehicle that was smoking, resulting in a significant police and fire response. The preliminary investigation determined that the driver drifted off the roadway due to inattention and collided with a mailbox. As a result of the collision, the driver complained of chest pain and was transported by San Ramon Valley Fire paramedics to San Ramon Regional Medical Center, where they were treated and released. CHP assumed responsibility for the traffic collision investigation.

# Blackhawk Police Services

## Volunteers in Policing

- Our three volunteers provided 9 hours of volunteer work throughout the month. The volunteers provided routine security checks, to include numerous Vacation House Checks, and provided extra patrol vehicle presence throughout the community.

## Notes from the Chief of Police

- On May 27<sup>th</sup> at approximately 9:30 a.m. Blackhawk Police Services attempted to stop and educate a juvenile riding an electric motorcycle (e-motorcycle) as the rider exited Blackhawk Plaza onto Blackhawk Rd. The juvenile refused to stop and fled into a residential area northwest of Blackhawk Rd and Camino Tassajara intersection. The investigation is ongoing to identify the juvenile rider. Parents are reminded that electric motorcycles are generally not street legal unless they meet all licensing, registration, and equipment requirements applicable to a motor vehicle.

1. Class 1 E-Bike: pedal assist only, no throttle, max speed 20 mph.
2. Class 2 E-Bike: pedal assist plus throttle, max speed 20 mph.
3. Class 3 E-Bike: pedal assist plus throttle, max speed 28 mph. Max 750 Watts. No riders under 16.
4. E-Scooter: no riders under 15. Must have an instructional permit or driver's license.
5. E-Motorcycle: no pedals require license, registration and all required safety equipment to be operated on the roadway. May **NOT** be **operated on the sidewalk, roadway, bicycle/equestrian/hiking/recreational trails or public land.**

Please help us keep everyone driving, riding and walking in the district safe. If you have any questions concerning e-bikes, e-scooters or e-motorcycles please contact Blackhawk Police Services.
