I am an LCSW/MPH (Licensed Clinical Social Worker with Masters of Social Welfare and a Masters of Public Health) who has worked in Contra Costa County for the past 20 years. I am a Mental Health Clinical Specialist at West County Adult Behavioral Health. I started my career in social services by working at one of the largest homeless shelters in San Francisco (now called Next Door). There I became an advocate for homeless people. I also became acutely aware of many of the contributing factors leading an individual to homelessness. Today, I support individuals on a micro level with many of those contributing factors. Now, I want to exercise my MPH skills and see how to leverage influence on a macro level. For example, our County no longer has a dual diagnosis substance abuse treatment program. This would be something that I would want to bring to the Council's attention. The reason I would want to serve on the Council on Homelessness is that I have 30 years of working with homeless individuals in professional capacities. I see on a daily basis how we are doing the best we can with what we have. I think we can do better, try harder, and I am motivated to support change. I have insight from my professional experience, willingness, and patience to see how I can be a part of a team that supports change/growth/movement for a seemingly chronic/hopeless "problem". Homelessness is a tragedy. It is not what someone would choose if they had other options. We can make a difference.

Describe your qualifications for this appointment. (NOTE: you may also include a copy of your resume with this application)

Professional experience: Work before graduate school: When I worked at the shelter at Polk & Geary (SF), I often worked on the women's floor where there were just two staff to make sure things stayed "cool" during the swing shift. There could be 100 homeless ladies who could be high or off their psych meds sleeping on the 4th floor of the shelter. I saw first hand what it is like to live in a homeless shelter. (1993-1997) Another shelter I worked at was one in Berkeley on Durant. I worked in the woman's/family shelter and the transitional housing upstairs. (during graduate school) I volunteered for 7 years at the Berkeley Free Clinic as a medic. (1993-2000) Work after graduate school: I worked for Asian American Recovery Services (AARS) providing behavioral health services to the folks on GA (General Assistance) in San Francisco. Many folks on GA are single adults who are homeless facing a myriad of issues. (2000-2005) The shelter at Polk & Geary was a "wet" shelter. That shelter was quite a bit different than the "dry" shelter run by the same agency. I provided some mental health services to the "dry" shelter after graduate school. After working full time at AARS in SF, I went to work in the inpatient psych unit and the Psychiatric Emergency Services at Contra Costa Regional Medical Center. There I became very familiar with that component of the continuum of care and I realized that people don't live in hospitals. Hospitals teach people to become patients they don't support clients with learning the behavioral skills to live in the community. As a clinician at West County BH, I work as a clinical case manager and a clinician with helping clinician build their life worth living and confronting behavioral health challenges. I have worked as an LCSW in the Mental Health Clinical Specialist classification since 2005. My co-workers and I are daily supporting homeless individuals and have unique insights to the challenges that homeless people face and the dearth of resources available.

I am an LCSW/MPH (Licensed Clinical Social Worker with Masters of Social Welfare and a Masters of Public Health) who has worked in Contra Costa County for the past 20 years. I am a Mental Health Clinical Specialist at West County Adult Behavioral Health. I started my career in social services by working at one of the largest homeless shelters in San Francisco (now called Next Door). There I became an advocate for homeless people. I also became acutely aware of many of the contributing factors leading an individual to homelessness. Today, I support individuals on a micro level with many of those contributing factors. Now, I want to exercise my MPH skills and see how to leverage influence on a macro level. For example, our County no longer has a dual diagnosis substance abuse treatment program. This would be something that I would want to bring to the Council's attention. The reason I would want to serve on the Council on Homelessness is that I have 30 years of working with homeless individuals in professional capacities. I see on a daily basis how we are doing the best we can with what we have. I think we can do better, try harder, and I am motivated to support change. I have insight from my professional experience, willingness, and patience to see how I can be a part of a team that supports change/growth/movement for a seemingly chronic/hopeless "problem". Homelessness is a tragedy. It is not what someone would choose if they had other options. We can make a difference.

Work before graduate school: When I worked at the shelter at Polk & Geary (SF), I often worked on the women's floor where there were just two staff to make sure things stayed "cool" during the swing shift. There could be 100 homeless ladies who could be high or off their psych meds sleeping on the 4th floor of the shelter. I saw first hand what it is like to live in a homeless shelter. Another shelter I worked at was one in Berkeley on Durant. I worked in the woman's/family shelter and the transitional housing upstairs. I volunteered for 7 years at the Berkeley Free Clinic as a medic. Work after graduate school: I worked for Asian American Recovery Services (AARS) providing behavioral health services to the folks on GA (General Assistance) in San Francisco. Many folks on GA are single adults who are homeless facing a myriad of issues. The shelter at Polk & Geary was a "wet" shelter. That shelter was quite a bit different than the "dry" shelter run by the same agency. I provided some mental health services to the "dry" shelter after graduate school. After working full time at AARS in SF, I went to work in the inpatient psych unit and the Psychiatric Emergency Services at Contra Costa Regional Medical Center. There I became very familiar with that component of the continuum of care and I realized that people don't live in Hospitals. Our consumers live in the community. I made a move to outpatient behavioral health care at West County Adult Behavioral Health. At West County I have honed my clinical skills and am now a Linehan Board Certified Dialectal Behavioral Therapy therapist.

	1. Structural discrimination/xenophobia that promotes fear of minorities/people who are different. This is extraordinarily palpable today with respect to the undocumented immigrants to this country. In the case of undocumented people, they are limited and prohibited from accessing resources (jobs/income) that leads to homelessness. There is also a long history in this country of subjecting minorities and withholding resources.
	2. Mental illness/substance users are also discriminated against. Mental illness and substance abuse can affect and become a problem for any human being. Once you have a mental illness or a substance abuse problem, people will treat you differently and can cause a person to be more vulnerable to becoming homeless. 	Idea #1:
	I will continue to beat my drum at every opportunity I get. Contra Costa County does not have a dual diagnosis program. We need a dual diagnosis program. We used to have Nevin House. That program was great and filled a very important need. Now that it is gone, there is a huge vacuum/need for this kind of a program. So many homeless people struggle with both addiction and mental health issues. Today, more than in the past, methamphetamine (crystal meth) is making more people paranoid and causing them to have psychotic symptoms that do not go away once they quit. We need a 6-18 month dual diagnosis program. This would be my number one idea for helping the homeless and people at risk of being unhoused.
	Idea #2: -when homeless people get sent to Psychiatric Emergency Services or to the inpatient psych services the Hospital is eager to turn people around as soon as possible, if there is space, they can be sent to Hope House, instead of the streets. The problem is that they can only stay at Hope House for 15-30 days. Due to the short term nature of their program, their staff have to put pressure on the consumers to find a placement or go back to the streets. This puts undue stress on the consumer and often leads to relapse of homelessness/substance use/AWOL/or other less desirable outcome. It sure would be nice if there were some kind of placement where people could go to after Hope House, while they continue to stabilize on their psych meds and continue to seek a more long term temporary or permanent placement.
