


Independent Living Skills

ILRSCC provides education and training to develop practical life skills that are imperative to independent living. Instruction is provided on an individualized basis and can include:

- Using public transportation

Assistive Technology

Assistive Technology is any object, device, or tool that allows one to live independently. ILRSCC helps people acquire the necessary assistive device for their needs and teaches consumers how to properly use them.

Institutional Transition & Diversion

R E S O U R C E S of Solano & Contra Costa Counties



Transition can mean helping a person to move from a nursing home to a place to live independently in their community. It can also mean helping a young person to move to their next steps after high school. Diversion includes services that help people with what they need to live independently in their own home so they do not have to live in a nursing home.

Voice Options

ILRSCC through a partnership with the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) <u>Deaf and</u> <u>Disabled Telecommunications Program (DDTP)</u>, the California Department of Rehabilitation's (DOR) Voice Options program provides eligible Californians who are unable to speak, or who have difficulty speaking, with a free speechgenerating device. The goal of this program is to ensure full and equal telephone communications access for all Californians with disabilities.

Community Education

ILRSCC conducts educational events and activities for the community on issues that affect the Disability Community and provides special topic speakers, sensitivity training, accessibility surveys, and consultations regarding compliance with relevant state & federal regulations.
