The Seventh-day Adventist Church in the Northern California Territory is committed to supporting communities in reaching functional zero for homelessness. As part of this mission, we have recently launched a Homelessness Task Force focused on organizing and mobilizing SDA churches across Contra Costa County. Currently, we are working to connect with more experienced organizations already active in this space to collaborate and complement their efforts. One of our key initiatives is supporting a local church in Pittsburg as it embarks on a project to build homes for individuals experiencing homelessness. I have the privilege of serving as the chair of this committee and am deeply committed to both learning from others and contributing to this important work. Although I had to step back for a season due to surgery and health challenges, I am now excited and ready to re-engage fully with the task force and continue moving this mission forward.

3. Please briefly describe any personal or professional skills, experiences, volunteer work, or connections (such as affiliations with organizations addressing homelessness) that you would bring to the Council on Homelessness and/or the specific seat you are applying for. My parents both grew up in extreme poverty and experienced homelessness as youth, and my mother lived in a women's shelter for several months when my sister and I were very young. Their resilience shaped my perspective on service and compassion. As a member of the Hispanic community, I am bilingual, speaking both Spanish and English. While many people speak Spanish more fluently than I do, I have experience in public speaking in both languages, which has allowed me to connect with diverse audiences. During the pandemic, I became a foster parent while also serving on Napa County's mental health committee and supporting seniors so they could remain in their homes while receiving the care and community they needed. At the same time, I organized local denominational pastors in Napa County and non-denominational pastors in St. Helena to join countywide COVID-19 response efforts. I partnered with nonprofits to distribute food to families in need, and I led initiatives to provide fire victims and evacuees with immediate necessities such as toiletries and clothing, as well as furniture for those who lost their homes. For the past 20 years, I have served as a pastor. In that role, I have learned the importance of mediation, de-escalation, and compassion in conversations. These experiences have strengthened my commitment to building bridges, supporting vulnerable communities, and ensuring that those facing crisis receive practical resources, spiritual and emotional care.

5. Unhoused people in Contra Costa County come from many different backgrounds in terms of race, ethnicity, culture, ability, age, sexual and gender identity, and immigration status. Please list and explain 3 reasons why certain groups might have a harder time accessing services than others. (400 words maximum) *

There are a couple of groups that face greater challenges in accessing services than others. The first is the African American community, and the second is the Hispanic and immigrant community. Both groups continue to encounter racial and systemic barriers that limit access to stable housing, employment, and supportive resources.

Historically, the United States has intentionally underserved African Americans. Even after the abolition of slavery, policies and practices promoted dehumanization and reinforced biases that contributed to disproportionately high incarceration rates, whick still exists today. Having a criminal record makes it more difficult for individuals to secure housing, qualify for services, and obtain stable employment. According to the National Alliance to End Homelessness, African Americans made up just 13 percent of the U.S. population in 2020, yet they accounted for more than 40 percent of the homeless population. At that time, Nan Roman, then-president and CEO of the organization, explained, "This isn't the fault of the homelessness sector, and it is not the fault of people experiencing homelessness. It is the fault of systems that have failed our most vulnerable populations, and leaders who have failed to protect them" (ABC News, January 22, 2020).

The Hispanic and immigrant community also experiences significant barriers. One of the most common challenges is the language barrier. Many service providers may not be bilingual, which limits access for individuals and families who primarily speak Spanish. This gap often leaves people unable to fully understand their options, complete paperwork, or advocate for themselves.

In addition to language challenges, fear of immigration consequences is another major obstacle. Some members of the community worry that seeking help might lead to detention or deportation, even when services are legally available to them. This fear discourages families from pursuing housing assistance, health care, or other supportive resources that could prevent or end homelessness. Combined, these barriers contribute to lower levels of service utilization and greater vulnerability to housing instability within the Hispanic and immigrant population.

Both the African American and Hispanic/immigrant communities face systemic barriers that make accessing services more difficult. Historical injustices, racial biases, language barriers, and fears related to immigration status all contribute to higher rates of homelessness and housing instability. Addressing these challenges requires not only expanding access to resources but also confronting the structural inequities and systemic failures that have left these communities disproportionately vulnerable. I hope that our Adventist community can serve as a meaningful partner in supporting a system that is gravely underfunded, taking active steps toward equity and ensuring that more individuals have the opportunity to secure stable housing and support.

Having experienced homelessness myself and emerged from encampments, I have undergone inficant healing and transformation through my involvement with the faith community. I have been uplifted and have had the privilege of uplifting others in urn. I continue to serve on the front lines of homelessness, and I believe that my experience will continue to serve the Council on Homelessness and our mmunity as a whole.

I experienced the call to ministry while a member of the Bay Area Rescue Mission's year-long residential recovery program, where God delivered me from an extended season of homelessness, hopelessness, and drug addiction. Along this narrow road of recovery and redemption, God has integrated all the pieces of my past life before homelessness, taking the skills I developed as an engineer and leader in various successful startup companies in Silicon Valley and applying these skills to the service of God and His people - no experience in life has been wasted. It has been my privilege over these past years to minister and continually serve in this space in various capacities, all united through my life for God and His people. I have administered and managed the men's emergency shelter at the Bay Area Rescue Mission. I have managed program operations at BARM, overseeing both our community kitchen and our food pantry during a time when we distributed over 1.2 million meals to the community we serve. I actively and regularly minister as a pastor and friend in encampment outreach. The church I serve as senior pastor works closely and intensely with our community; most of the congregation is formerly homeless, with several members of my congregation residing at A&A Health Services in San Pablo (Adult residential services for those with dual diagnosis). My church founded a nonprofit that has operated a series of Sober Living Environments for the past 18 years; I managed one of these homes for three years. These SLE homes serve men escaping homelessness and drug addiction. I formerly served on the Board of Directors for Way2Love, Inc., a local nonprofit that has successfully abated the large Castro Encampment, providing housing and support for nearly the entire encampment. I have served on the Council on Homelessness as the Faith Community Representative for two consecutive terms, and I hope to continue this service. In my vocational work in the nonprofit space serving the unhoused, I have continually sought growth and development to professionalize the ministry work. I have completed my Bachelor of Arts in Christian Ministry & Leadership, Ministry Management Concentration, focusing on curriculum development, cultural humility, program modeling, fundraising, strategic planning, finance, grant writing, and leadership development. I am currently attending grad school and am two terms away from completing my MBA, the curriculum centered on leadership in Christ-centered nonprofits. In short, ministry work in this space is my passion and life's work. God has been so kind to me, and I seek to share that kindness with others.

	There are many different reasons why certain groups might have a harder time accessing services than others, but the following illustrate three of many reasons.
	Language and Cultural Barriers: Many unhoused people come from immigrant and Spanish-speaking communities. Without clear and consistent translation or culturally specific outreach, these residents may not know what resources are available to them or how to navigate these resources. Furthermore, there are some strong cultural stigmas around homelessness and mental health, and this can discourage individuals from seeking the services they might need to thrive better.
	Legal and Documentation Barriers: Some services require identification or proof of residency. Some federal housing assistance programs require applicants to be U.S. Citizens or have eligible immigration status. Fear of deportation or other legal repercussions may lead some to avoid housing resources altogether, even if the qualify.
	System Navigation Barriers: For individuals facing trauma, mental illness, or limited literacy, the complicated nature of navigating system complexity for housing and services can be overwhelming. Without strong and consistent case management, many people will fall through the cracks and not obtain the housing or services available to them. I c

	One thing that I am greatly encouraged by within the faith community is the emergence of the YIGBY (Yes In God's Back Yard) Movement. This movement seeks to take advantage of new state laws and advocate for zoning changes that will allow church-owned land to be used for affordable housing projects. While there have been high-visibility projects in our CoC as of late (Hope Solution's Hope Village in Walnut Creek comes to mind), there are a lot of other initiatives that are happening in denominational discussions across the Bay Area that I have been privileged to participate in, including conversations around creative financing for these housing initiatives. I would love to bring more of this work to our CoC, as there is a great deal of potential to house people through this work.
