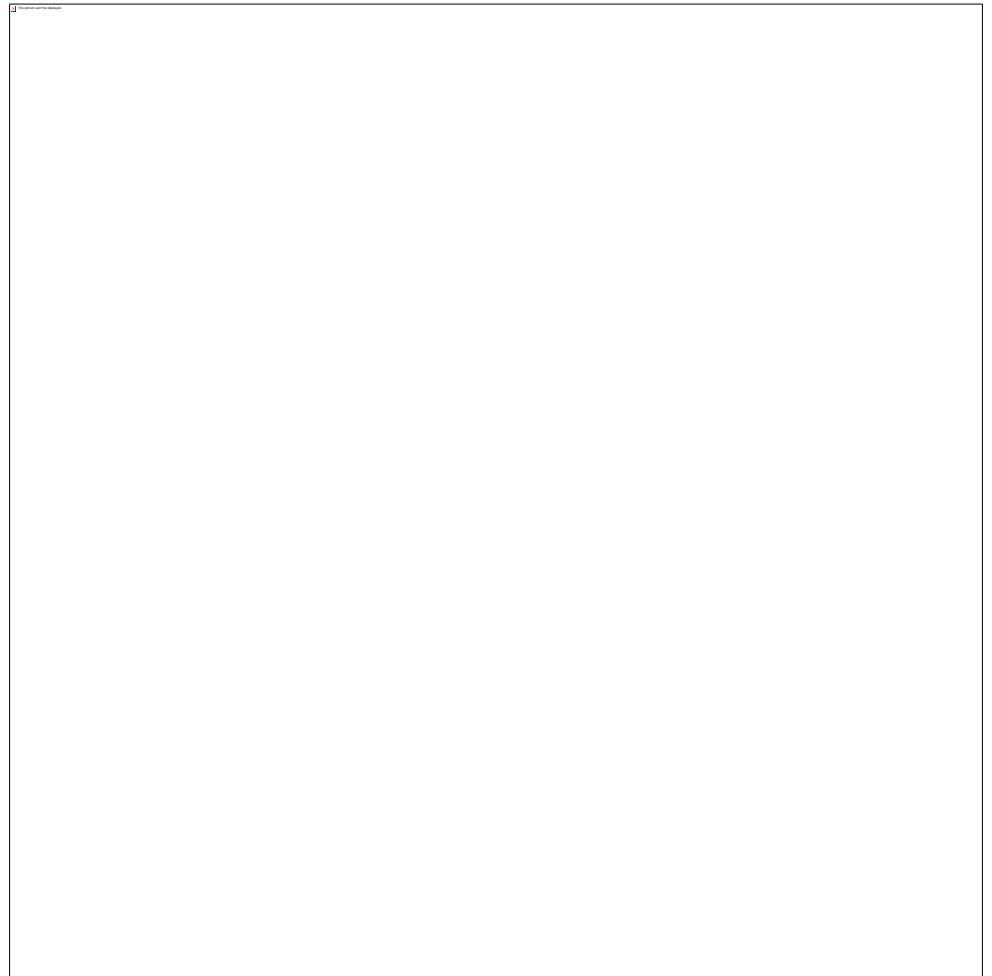

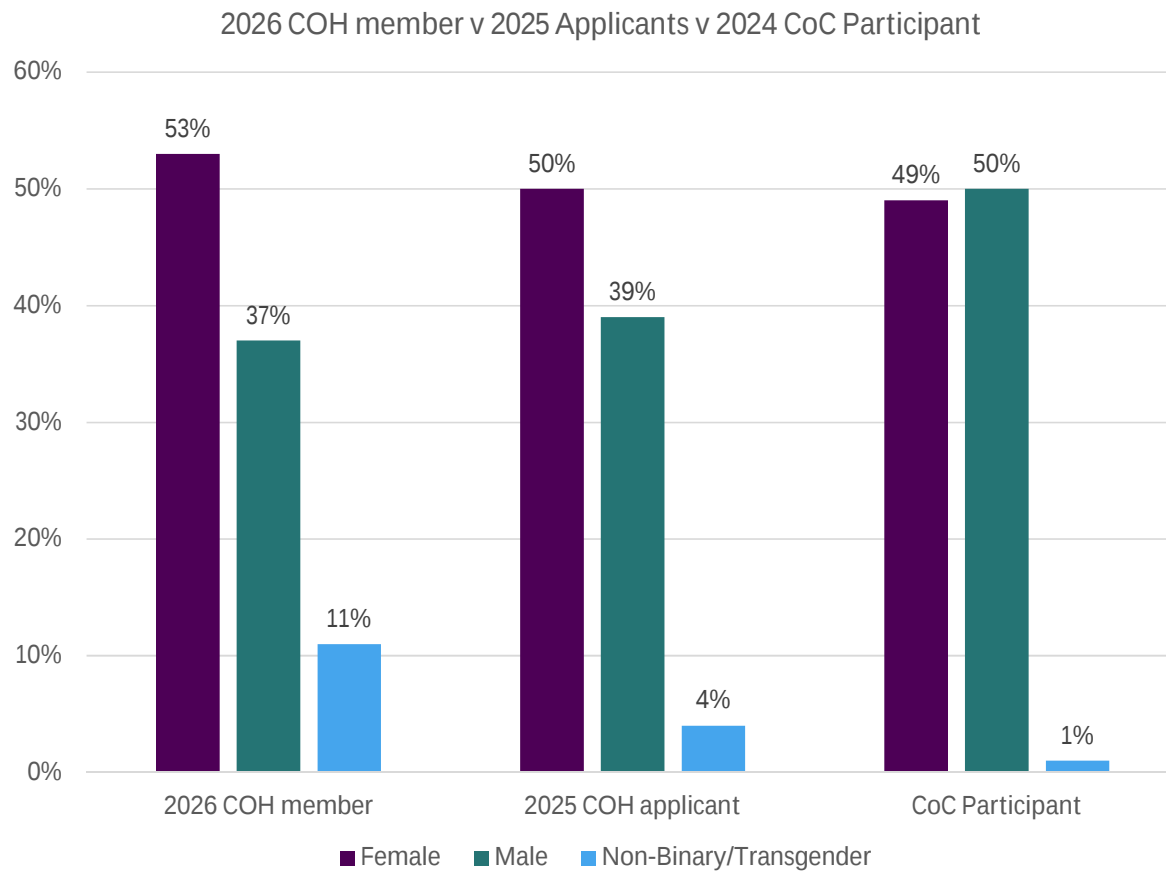

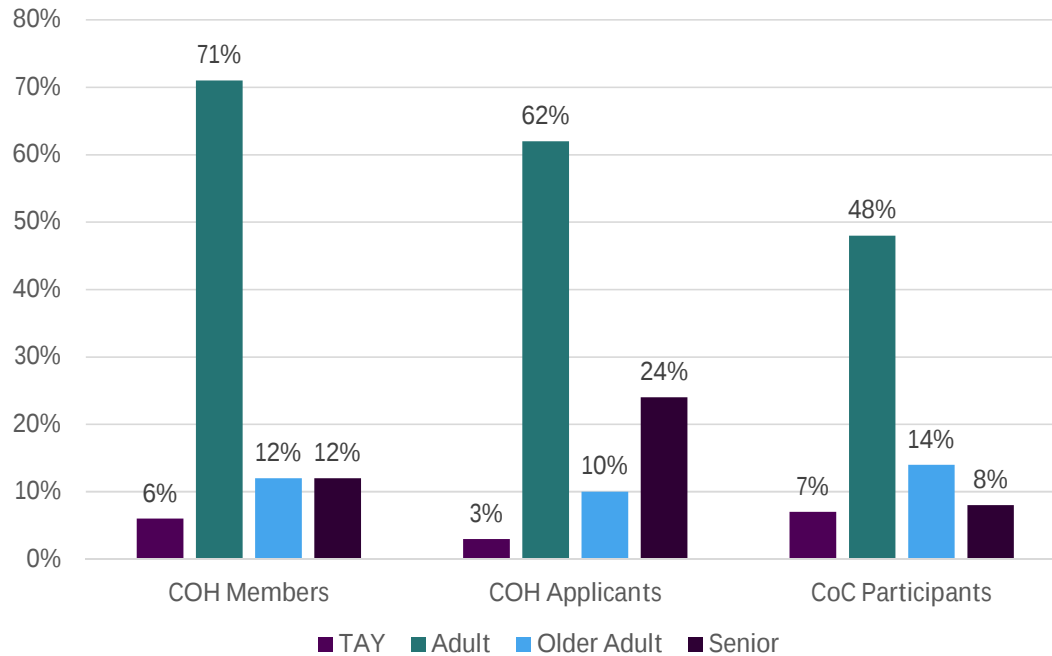
- Less men apply for and sit on CoH compared to men experiencing homelessness in Contra Costa County

2026 COH member v 2025 COH applicants v 2024 CoC participants

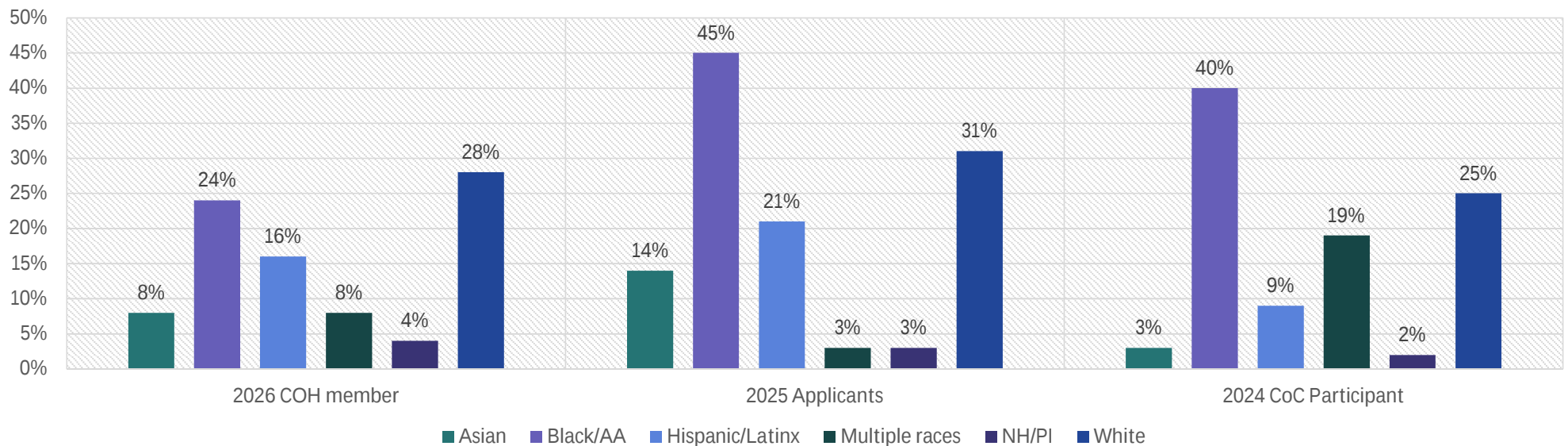

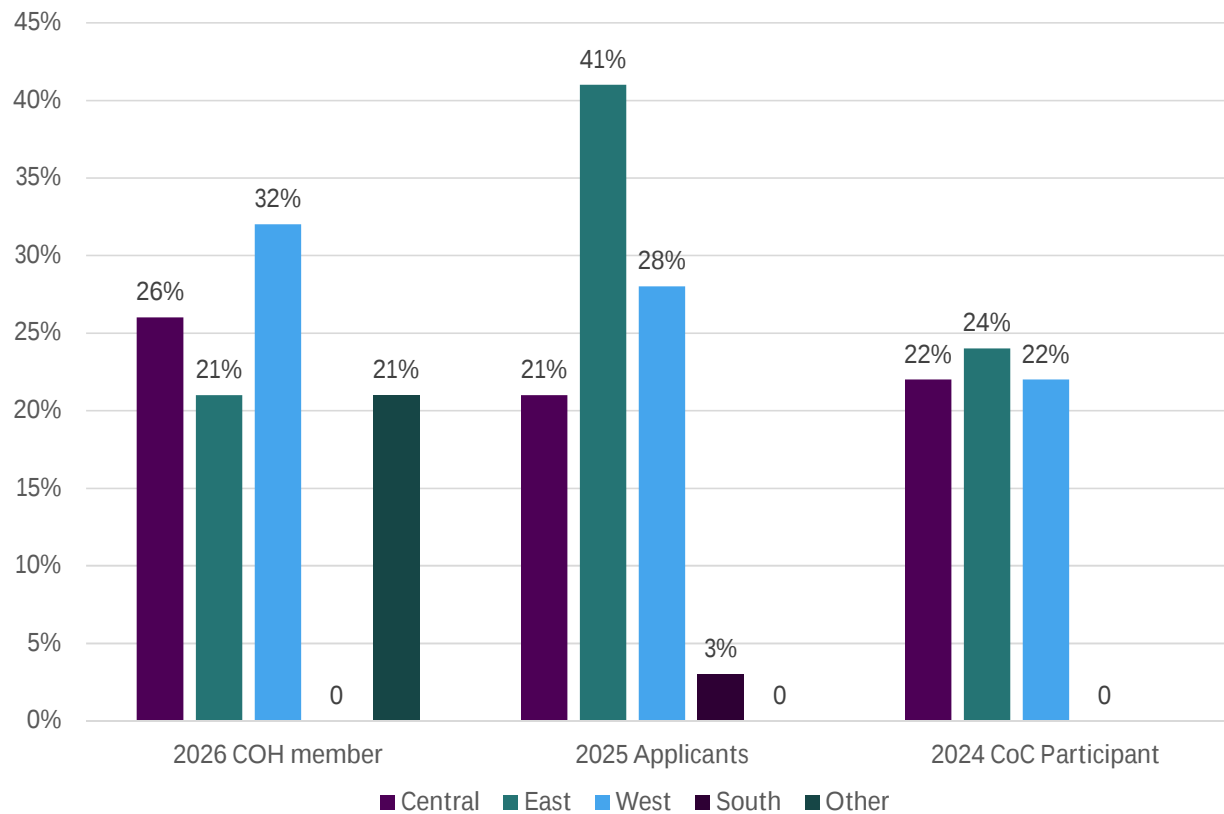

CONSIDERING DIVERSITY IN COH APPLICATION MATERIALS

- 12 points (out of 68 or 18%) are associated with lived experience of homelessness or connection to someone with lived experience of homelessness.
- 12 pts (18%) are associated with an applicant's commitment to equity and ensuring that all communities have equal access to services

BROAD OUTREACH IN COH RECRUITMENT PROCESS

- The Nominating Panel receives a short training on implicit bias during orientation.
- Recruitment is announced via email, website, and at several committee meetings.
- Recruitment through organizations and networks that serve and work with underrepresented groups on the CoH is important.
- Recruitment is open for at least 2 weeks (3 weeks this year).

RECOMMENDATION #1: QUESTION 5

- Staff recommendation - Consider deleting this question as responses from 2025 weren't particularly helpful, and to align with federal policy
- Current Question - *Unhoused people in Contra Costa County come from many different backgrounds in terms of race, ethnicity, culture, ability, age, sexual and gender identity, and immigration status. Please list and explain 3 reasons why certain groups might have a harder time accessing services than others. (400 words maximum)*

RECOMMENDATION #2: QUESTION 8

- Staff recommendation - Consider deleting or rewording this question to align with federal policy
- Current Question - *The Council is committed to the Housing First approach, which means people can get into housing without needing to meet certain requirements like being sober, participating in a religious program, or having a job. In response, the Council has established this Guiding Principle: Homelessness is first a housing issue, and necessary supports and services are critical to help people remain housed. Our system must be nimble and flexible enough to respond through the shared responsibility, accountability, and transparency of the community.*
 - *Do you agree with the Housing First approach and Guiding Principle described above?*
- Possible revision - remove "Housing First" term but maintain the rest of the question

RECOMMENDATION #4: DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

- Staff recommendation – Consider deleting section intro and consider whether to keep demographic questions
- Current Introduction – The Council aims to engage as broad a representation as possible of abilities, ages, sexual and gender identities, immigration statuses, and racial, ethnic, and cultural backgrounds, and geographical representation within the County. Responses to the following questions are optional and will be considered in aggregate to ensure that we have recruited a diverse pool of applicants. The Nominating Panel will not review applicants' responses to the following questions.
- Current Demographic Questions
 - What are your pronouns?
 - What is your gender identity?
 - What is your sexual orientation?
 - What best describes your age? (responses are age groupings)
 - What best describes your race/ethnicity?
 - Please identify the following geographic areas you represent and/or spend the most time in by selection of one or more of the options below. (responses are geographic areas of Contra Costa County)
 - Is there any other information you would like to share, including anything that would help us understand how you would contribute to the diverse representation of people and experiences on the Council?

RECOMMENDATION #1 RE: SUPPLEMENTAL QUESTION 5

- Feedback from 2024: Make application questions more readable and accessible to applicants, particularly those with lived experience of homelessness

▪ Current Question 5

- *“Please share and explain two (2) ideas to help Contra Costa County better support unhoused people and people at risk of being unhoused. Your ideas can come from your own experience receiving services, your work, and/or what you’ve seen in the news.”*



▪ Proposed Revision

- *“Please share and explain two (2) ideas to help Contra Costa County better support people who are unhoused and people at risk of being unhoused. Your ideas can come from your own experience receiving services, your work, and/or what you’ve seen in the news.”*

RECOMMENDATION #5: PROVIDE OPPORTUNITY FOR INCUMBENT CANDIDATES TO RECEIVE EXTRA POINTS

- Feedback from 2024: consider giving extra points to incumbent candidates to encourage continuity
- Current scoring rubric: *No points for incumbent candidates*
- In 2023 and 2024 there were 5 instances where the incumbent either won or lost by a total of 7 points or less (incumbent lost in 1 of those 5 instances by 6.5 points)
- Staff proposes a new scoring factor: Incumbent candidates (those who are currently serving on the Council) who have attended at least 75% of monthly Council meetings AND participated in at least 2 committees/work groups/panels (defined by at least 50% attendance in those meetings) in their current term to date will receive 5 bonus points.
- Other options:
 - Do not incentivize incumbent candidates (leave scoring rubric as is)
 - Provide extra points to incumbent candidates in their 1st or 2nd term only (encourages some continuity)
 - Provide extra points to all incumbent candidates (regardless of participation or tenure)

6 pts for a response that speaks GENERALLY about the value they would bring to the CoH

(3) Applicant's response reflects lived experience or connection to someone with lived experience. **(12 pts)**

12 pts for applicant currently experiencing homelessness (as self-identified)

10 pts for applicant with experience of homelessness within the past 7 years (as self-identified)

8 pts for applicant with experience of homelessness at some point within their life (as self-identified)

4 pts for connection to someone with lived experience

0 pts for no personal lived experience

(4) Applicant's response reflects **that they value equity and ensuring that all communities have equal access to services. (12 pts)**
