A proposed five-year, 5/8-cent sales tax measure is under consideration to help offset anticipated federal reductions to essential services, including food assistance and healthcare programs.

An update was also provided on the Community Impact Fund grant program, which received over 220 applications across District 1. Awards of up to \$50,000 are currently under review, with funding recommendations expected within the coming month.

SR.1 Land Use Committee: Joann Pavlinec, Jinwei Zhang

The Council received an update regarding a residential project located at 6418 Claremont Avenue in Richmond. The property owner is proposing the installation of a pre-fabricated garage at the rear of the property.

Initial review indicates that the project meets standard development requirements, including appropriate setbacks and general zoning compliance. Based on the information provided, the proposal appears consistent with applicable County regulations.

A recommendation was submitted to include minor conditions related to site aesthetics, specifically ensuring that the driveway and the proposed garage structure are properly painted and maintained.

It was noted that the project was brought forward for review following a neighboring property concern,

rather than due to any identified code or permitting deficiencies. No significant land use conflicts were identified at this stage, and the project may proceed subject to standard review and incorporation of the noted conditions.

7. Agenda Items / Speakers for Upcoming ERHMAC Meetings

The Council discussed planning efforts for a proposed East Richmond Heights community festival, tentatively scheduled for August 1, 2026. Initial coordination will include vendor outreach, permit requirements, volunteer organization, and event logistics.

Councilmembers emphasized the need to begin early coordination with County departments, including Public Works and Fire Protection, to ensure compliance with permitting and safety requirements.

Future agenda items will include more detailed planning discussions, including vendor coordination, food service requirements, and community outreach efforts.

Discussion included ongoing community concerns related to the Wildcat Canyon bike trail project. Council members requested that environmental review materials and public comment opportunities be shared broadly to support community awareness and engagement.

Additional concerns were raised regarding a fenced-off public access path along Kensington Avenue. Staff will follow up with Public Works to clarify ownership, access status, and any planned improvements or decisions related to the site.

Residents raised ongoing concerns regarding abandoned vehicles, trailers, and RVs within the public right-of-way. Staff will coordinate with Code Enforcement and community service officers to clarify enforcement processes, confirm the status of open cases, and ensure consistent follow-up on reported issues.

Specific locations discussed include areas along North Arlington Avenue and nearby intersections, where residents reported continued presence of vehicles despite prior enforcement actions.
