1. Call to Order/Roll Call/Pledge of Allegiance

2. Approval of Agenda

3. Approval of Minutes from January meeting

4. Public Comment –

Pastor Crawford shared that there are Hot Showers and Hot Meals every Tuesday as well as a
brown bag lunch program. They are working with Loaves and Fishes.

Deborah Roberts shared there is a Dollar Energy Program with PG&E for people with
hardships. They can come by their Church on Clearland and Willow Pass on Tuesdays and
Thursdays to apply.

Larry Estes shared that the Bay Point Historical Committee had made a request to the
Ambrose Recreation and Park District for space to share our community history but had not
heard back yet. Supervisor Glover had been supportive and was welcoming assistance.

5. Agency Reports

a. **Supervisor Scales-Preston** – was welcomed by the MAC members and shared her
thoughts with us and we are looking forward to working together.

b. **Contra Costa Sheriff's Office – Lt. Rhenelle Daniels** – reported that violence is down

but street shows continue to be a problem. Muir station is leading in arrest. He shared that the Holiday events had went well and many families were served. They are starting an Anti-Gang Basketball program as well as other community events. He also shared that the next Citizen's Academy is starting soon.

- c. **Contra Costa Code Enforcement** – Joe Losado and Bill Lovan – The community welcomed Joe Losado back. He reported that in December they had opened 30 new cases, closed 34 and have 41 current.
- d. **Contra Costa Fire Protection District** – Michelle RineHart- shared that the Con-Fire Open House had been a big success. She shared it is important to know your zone and be ready to evacuate when needed. The new Chief will soon be releasing local maps.
- e. **Golden State Water** – Tina Gonzalez shared they continue to upgrade equipment and plan their capitol projects'
- f. **MOTCO** – Officer Balala was here to follow up on our request to explore being able to evacuate through the base in case of emergency. They do work with Clyde for possible flooding issues and are willing to work with us as well. They will be doing an exercise in June and we can be part of that.

6. Items for Discussion and/or Action:

- a. **Delta Diablo**, Brian Thomas, Deputy General Manager – The MAC received a report on the recent even that raw sewage had been leaked into the marsh area. The leak was on the MOTCO property and was noticed when there was a reduction in waste water. They are in the process of remediating the problem.
- b. **Contra Costa County Office of Emergency Services** – Beatriz Portillo, Senior Emergency Planning Coordinator – Beatriz shared that is important to be ready for an emergency and that everyone should register their phone number with emergency services. She gave example of the different types of emergencies and what you should have on hand. They are looking for more places to go in the community to get more information out to residents.

Member Reports – Chair Mason shared the loss of Big Daddy Ross' Café on the waterfront. It had been a long time business that supported the community and would be missed by all.

Member Lessley shared the importance of preserving and sharing our community history with our youth. She asked anyone present that knew of a place for us to have a space please let us know.
