2. Review and Accept Minutes (May 4, 2026)

Yvonne motioned to accept the minutes, Erin seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

3. FACT Membership Update, Organization & Action Items

Membership Updates

- Committee Chair Isabel Renggenathen announced her resignation, effective 6/2/26.
- Committee Vice Chair Kay Reed will not renew membership, effective for the September meeting.
- The Committee recommended moving forward with Chair and Vice Chair elections/nominations.
Yvonne nominated Erin for Chair, Mary seconded. Motion Passed unanimously.
Erin nominated Yvonne for Vice Chair, Dr. Shires seconded. Motion Passed unanimously.
- Erin effective as Chair starting 6/2/26. Yvonne will be effective as Vice Chair starting 10/1/26.
- Advised Committee, SB 827, Effective January 1, 2026 requiring all advisory body committees to take a financial training session. This requirement is due by January 1, 2028. Training specifics are pending and will be sent to the Committee once received.
- Membership Renewal Update for terms ending September 30, 2026:

- Advised Committee, still pending FACT Committee membership applications from the Clerk of the Board, as a result, we are not able to review/vote on non-District FACT seat membership renewals at this meeting.
- In order to meet term deadlines, must review/vet at the August meeting.
- Staff will send a follow up email after the meeting to those that are not yet received by the Clerk of the Board.

4. FACT Grantee Update: STAND!

- Discussion and Next Steps
- STAND! runs a children's counseling center for domestic violence victims. Due to budget impacts they are not going to be able to provide some programming services in 2026/27.
- STAND! had to cut 3 programs to keep their main programming running and notified FACT staff that they would not be able to renew their FACT contract for FY26/27 because the contracted services were one of the programs that was cut. This makes available \$100,000 in FACT funding for FY26-27.
- County Counsel and County Public Works/Purchasing are reviewing the options for the available funds and will advise FACT staff. Two options are being considered: Divide the available funds among the remaining contracts or offer the available funds to first runner up from the RFP process.
- The FACT Committee discussed and indicated that their 1st choice is to divide the available funds evenly amongst the remaining 5 contracts.

FACT Grantee Update: 26/27 Renewal Status

- a. 2 contracts have been submitted to the EHSD contracts unit for final preparations.
- b. Final 3 service plans and budgets should arrive this week for review.
- c. Renewals are on time and moving along.

5. FACT 2026 Tax Donation Flyer

- Reviewed the recommended changes made to the 2025 Flyer as provided by Dr. Shires. A mock up flyer was included in the agenda packet for review.
- Staff confirmed the 2026 FACT Tax Donation Flyer must be printed through CCC Public Works Printing department. Securing an outside vendor must go through County Purchasing/Procurement requirements. The deadlines associated with submitting the flyer for mailing do not support an external vendor this year. Could be something the Committee can consider in the future.
- Staff provided feedback in response to the data point that was requested by the Committee to be edited at the last meeting. Upon review, EHSD leadership has decided the current allegation number data point is the only available option to utilize in the flyer.

6. FACT Visibility in the County

- a. Discussion item to explore the idea of increasing visibility of the FACT Committee when in public. FACT Committee name tags were discussed as something could be purchased and worn when in public settings.
- b. Discussion amongst the Committee members, which included when and where the name tags would be worn, potential conflicts of interest related to their professional work, and the like.
- c. Committee decided nametags would not be a viable option to seek further.

To whom it may concern: I am pleased to apply to renew my membership on the Family & Children's Trust Committee (FACT) for a second term. It has been a pleasure to serve on FACT for the past two years. I am prepared and enthused to continue contributing to FACT's critical mission of making recommendations to the County on the allocation of funds for the prevention and treatment of child abuse and neglect for families and children. As a lifelong Contra Costa resident, I am personally committed to acting in service of the safety and well-being of our County's children and families. I am a social worker by training, and my graduate studies centered on organizational & community dynamics, social determinants of health, and upstream prevention from a public health lens. I am a systems thinker and peace builder, guided by core frameworks of anti-racism, equity, and social justice. My professional roots in the Contra Costa violence prevention and social service sectors run deep. I am privileged to have had an undergraduate summer internship in 2012 with the Alliance to End Abuse (formerly Zero Tolerance), where I researched and analyzed protocols for identifying and addressing cases of interpersonal violence experienced by clients within County public agencies and helped design educational materials for community agencies about the effects of abuse. I also understand the experience of providing quality, on-the-ground violence prevention services from the perspective of a non-profit, community-based agency. At Monument Crisis Center, I developed, implemented, and evaluated a pilot program to prevent violence among youth, increase academic achievement for low-income and underserved youth, and holistically support families. I demonstrated my ability to collaborate effectively on multi-disciplinary teams toward violence prevention by serving as a working group member of the Contra Costa County Blueprint to Prevent Interpersonal Violence. While differently structured than FACT, the Blueprint process similarly involved reviewing data and reports to conduct needs assessment then synthesize and uplift community priorities. As Trauma & Resiliency Coordinator at First 5, I promoted the implementation of trauma-informed care and systems across the County by maintaining the Contra Costa Network of Care website and developing relationships with diverse providers and stakeholders. My successful coordination of First 5's ACEs Aware Network of Care Grant streamlined referral pathways between healthcare providers and community-based resources to reduce toxic stress, prevent adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), and bolster resiliency for children and families. Most recently, I have served for two years as First 5's primary liaison with the five First 5 Centers. Guided by the Five Protective Factors of the Strengthening Families Approach, the Centers are designed to support families with children aged 0-5. Center programs increase caregivers' understanding of child development and parenting, meet families' basic needs, and build community - all research-supported, evidence-based components that lead to better family outcomes and prevent child neglect and abuse. This work has provided me experience and knowledge around programs that promote early intervention, prevention, and the Five Protective Factors, which will serve me well in supporting FACT's recommendation and contract monitoring processes for community agency grantees receiving FACT funding.
