Having co-founded Ladki Love, a 501c3 non-profit dedicated to preventing the abandonment of young girls in India, I've seen firsthand the transformative power of advocacy and resource allocation for marginalized communities. I am deeply committed to championing the welfare of women and girls in our county, with a focus on addressing economic disparities, enhancing access to resources, and creating lasting policy impact.

I am well-qualified to serve on the Contra Costa Commission for Women and Girls due to my extensive experience in advocacy, public policy, and community engagement. As the co-founder of Ladki Love, a nonprofit dedicated to empowering women and girls by preventing abandonment and promoting education, I have developed and implemented strategic programs, managed outreach efforts, and supported over 75 ambassadors across 10 states. This work has honed my ability to address systemic inequities and provide resources to economically disadvantaged women and girls. My background in public policy includes serving as an intern for Assemblymember Cecilia Aguiar-Curry, where I contributed to legislative efforts impacting California, and as University Affairs Chair for the UC Student Association, where I advocated for policies to promote equity in higher education. Additionally, as co-curator of the 2024 State of the Net Conference, I organized panels on key societal issues, including youth safety and equitable technology, working closely with government leaders to drive impactful conversations. My current role as a State and Local Government consultant at Guidehouse further deepens my understanding of public sector challenges and collaborative solutions. Finally, my time as a Parks and Community Services Student Commissioner and Teen Council Chair for the City of San Ramon provided me with valuable civic engagement experience, particularly in addressing community needs and improving access to vital resources. These experiences collectively position me to contribute meaningfully to the commission's mission of advocating for and improving the lives of women and girls in Contra Costa County.
