- Roll Call and Introductions
 The meeting was called to order at 9:01 AM.
 Committee Chair Supervisor John Gioia and Committee Vice Chair Federal Glover were present.
- Public comment on any item under the jurisdiction of the Committee and not on this agenda (speakers may be limited to two minutes).
 No public comments were received.
- 3. APPROVE the July 11, 2024 Industrial Safety Ordinance/Community Warning Meeting Minutes Minutes approved. One public comment was received.
- 4. APPROVE the August 6, 2024 ISO/CWS Meeting Minutes Minutes approved. No public comments were received.
- 5. RECEIVE a status report regarding proposed modifications to the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Incident Notification Policy for Level 1 incident notifications to the public and PROVIDE direction as necessary.
 - Update provided by Adam Springer. Discussed status of CWS policy changes, community messaging, and technology changes. Per CWS Manager Julie Beach, implementation is anticipated for the beginning of 2025, with a month of testing prior to going live. The committee discussed nuances in the notification policy for flaring events and CWS opt-in vs opt-out. Additional information can be found in the attached
 Motification Policy Draft 8.27.24"><u>HazMat Notification Policy Draft 8.27.24</u> document.
 - Three public comments were received.
- 6. RECEIVE a report regarding potential revisions to the Industrial Safety Ordinance to include tank terminal facilities and PROVIDE direction as necessary.
 - Update provided by Nicole Heath. The committee discussed the new facilities that would fall under the proposed ISO amendments. These amendments will go to the Board of Supervisors on 9/10/2024 at 9:00 AM. The committee also discussed the implementation of a local ISO City of Martinez and Pittsburg, as well as amendments to the City of Richmond's RISO.
 - One public comment was received.

- 7. RECEIVE a status report regarding the independent incident investigation into the November 24-25, 2022 Spent Catalyst Release at the PBF Refinery and PROVIDE direction as necessary. Update provided by Tim Mullowney (Scott Berger and Associates). Eight root causes were identified, in addition to two contributing causes, encompassing process hazard analysis (PHA) guidance, procedure deviation, procedure management, stop work, training, fatigue management, and instrument troubleshooting. The board discussed report timelines following qualifying incidents within the county. Three public comments were received.
- 8. RECEIVE an update from the Oversight Committee regarding the investigation into the spent catalyst release that occurred on November 24-25, 2022 at the Martinez Refining Company. Update provided by Nicole Heath. For the independent safety culture assessment, the 45-day public comment period is open, a public meeting was held 8/15/2024, and the period will be closing 9/16/2024. Public comments will be incorporated into the report, which will be finalized and brought to the Board before the end of the year. One public comment was received.

Meeting Minutes:

- Roll Call and Introductions
 The meeting was called to order at 9:36 AM.
 Committee Chair Supervisor John Gioia and Committee Vice Chair Federal Glover were present.
- Public comment on any item under the jurisdiction of the Committee and not on this agenda (speakers may be limited to two minutes).
 No public comments received.
- 3. RECEIVE a status report regarding the Safety Culture Assessment of the Martinez Refining Company as a result of the November 24-25, 2024 Spent Catalyst Release and PROVIDE direction as necessary. Report provided by Scott Berger and Associates, LLC. The report included the results of the independent safety culture assessment at PBF Energy Martinez Refining Company (MRC). This is the updated report following the end of the 45-day public comment period. The purpose of the study was to assess process safety management systems at the facility, assess facility leadership commitment to execution of these systems, and compare the results of the study to the facility's internal culture survey results. Opportunities for improvement include increased learning from incident investigations, maintaining consistency within the procedure deviation process, closing gaps in the facility's asset integrity program, and better-managing audit action item timelines. This report also highlighted several culturally positive findings, including emergency preparedness, leadership commitment to process safety management, and mechanical integrity management systems. In comparison with MRC's own internal culture survey, Scott Berger noted scoring rubric bias and lack of focus in analysis of the results. Using a weighted method, Scott Berger's analysis noted strengths within personal responsibility of employees, reporting of incidents and near-misses, and comfort using stop work authority. On the other hand, the analysis noted weaknesses surrounding pressure to complete work-related tasks, gaps in preventative maintenance, and gaps in knowledge-sharing for incident investigations. Five public comments were received during the public comment period, with one minor change appended to the report to reduce potential confusion.

The committee members discussed how the implementation of these recommendations will be tracked and managed, including multiple items due both this year and next year, along with the Health Department's HazMat division follow-up in the implementation. This follow-up includes close coordination with MRC management to ensure that items are being completed within specified timelines and are meeting the intent of each recommendation.

No public comments received.
