4. Chief of Police Report – March '26

A. 599 Calls for Service: 5 Reports, 1 Felony, 1 Misdemeanor, 0 Arrests

Felonies:

- Unknown suspect(s) attempted to complete a fraudulent electronic fund transfer from the victim’s American Express Business line of credit.

Transaction was frozen by American Express pending the investigation. The case has been forwarded to Investigations Division.

Misdemeanors:

- An unknown suspect attempted to open a PayPal credit account using the victim’s personal information. No card was issued and application was closed. The investigation is ongoing.

B. Arrests – none

\*\* Other reports were supplemental and/or civil in nature.

C. Incidents of Interest

- On March 20, 2026, Blackhawk Deputy and several Deputies from the Valley Station and SRVFD responded to a report of a person in mental crisis, armed with a knife. Deputies de-escalated the situation and the individual was transported by ambulance for treatment.

D. Volunteers in Policing: 15 hours served by four volunteers. All volunteers provided routine security checks and Vacation House Checks/extra patrol. Have an opening for 1 volunteer and currently accepting applications. Volunteers can stay as long as they want.

E. Items of interest:

- Chief Dickerson expressed his excitement and honor in being selected and looks forward to serving the Blackhawk community. He also reminded the community of tips to keep you home safe while traveling for Spring Break or any other time during the year, to deter burglars.

- Some issues up at the Plaza but mostly juveniles and minor events. Easter Morning arrests of intoxicated persons were arrested. County is working with the receiver who oversees the Plaza, Carol Mascali provided a general update.

Next Coffee with the Chief will be on April 15, 2026 (9-11am) at Blackhawk Dr. and Blackhawk Meadow Dr. Blackhawk HOA Town Hall meeting scheduled for April 16<sup>th</sup> @6pm.

# Blackhawk Police Services

## Summary for April 2026

Blackhawk and Valley Station Deputies either initiated or responded to the following calls for service:

- 610 ~ Total calls for service in Blackhawk
- 6 ~ Total police reports were taken in Blackhawk

**Felonies** – There no felony crimes reported in the District.

**Misdemeanors** – There was 2 misdemeanors reported in the District.

- On April 5, 2026, a business manager reported an intoxicated individual who was consuming an alcoholic beverage in the Plaza. Deputies responded to the scene, and two individuals were subsequently arrested for public intoxication and for obstructing or resisting a police officer. Both were booked at the Martinez Detention Facility.
- On April 30, 2026, a Blackhawk deputy responded to a 911 call reporting a single-vehicle rollover collision in the 5000 block of Blackhawk Drive, with the driver trapped inside. The California Highway Patrol (CHP) responded, assumed control of the investigation, and subsequently arrested the driver on suspicion of DUI.

**Arrests** – There were 3 arrests in the District for the month.

## Incidents of Interest

- On April 5, 2026, at approximately 9:00 a.m., a Blackhawk deputy and a Valley Station deputy responded to Blackhawk Plaza following a report of an intoxicated individual. Upon arrival, the deputies encountered five adult males who refused to comply with their commands. One individual fled into the plaza, leading to a foot pursuit, and physically resisted deputies attempting to detain him. Additional personnel from Valley Station and Danville Police Department responded to assist in controlling and de-escalating the situation. Two individuals were subsequently arrested for public intoxication and obstructing a police officer and were booked at the Martinez Detention Facility.

## Volunteers in Policing

- Our four volunteers provided 15 hours of volunteer work throughout the month. The volunteers provided routine security checks, to include numerous Vacation House Checks, and provided extra patrol vehicle presence throughout the community.

## Notes from the Chief of Police

- With warmer weather, more pedestrians are walking and running in the Blackhawk community. Please keep the following safety tips in mind:
  1. Slow down and obey all traffic control signs.
  2. Always watch for pedestrians and minimize blind spots.
  3. Use extra caution in low-light conditions, when pedestrians are harder to see.
  4. Always yield to pedestrians.
  5. Be prepared to stop when turning or approaching a crosswalk.
  6. Never pass a vehicle stopped at a crosswalk.
  7. Follow posted speed limits.
  8. Check carefully for pedestrians when backing up.
