
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Center Enrollment Rates

Current Slot Allotments:


- Federal Slots (Head Start) = 1,201 (1,201 filled slots as of May 2025)
- State Slots (CDE and CDSS) = 764 (764 filled slots as of May 2025)
- Total Unique Slots = 1,345 (1,345 filled slots as of May 2025)

Current Enrollment Requirements:


- Federally Funded = 97% slots filled
- State Funded = Currently "hold harmless" meaning no penalties for not filling all slots. When "hold harmless" ends in June 2025, we will no longer be funded for unfilled slots.

Average Center Meals & Snacks Per Day




Center Teacher and Site Supervisor Vacancies

- Received update on OHS Risk Assessment Notification (RAN) Monitoring Report deficiency


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Head Start Budget Expenditures

All credit card expenditures are made by authorized staff for budgeted purchases to support reasonable program expenditures.

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





Indicators with non-compliances over 10% in May 2025:

Alarms and locks in hallways, front doors, and 1. gates are in working order. (10/89 = 11% non-compliance)

Unusual Incidents & Citations



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Reportable incidents as defined by the Office of Head Start (OHS)

OHS considers a "significant incident" to be any incident that results in serious injury or harm to a child, violates Head Start standards of conduct at <u>45 CFR</u> <u>§1302.90(c)</u>, or results in a child being left alone, unsupervised, or released to an unauthorized adult. A program must report all significant incidents affecting the health and safety of children with 7 days.

California Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing Citations

<u>Type A:</u> An immediate risk to the health, safety or personal rights of children in care.

<u>Type B:</u> If not corrected right away, may be a risk to the health, safety, and personal rights of the children in care.

- May 30: Met with TTA to review final Quality Improvement Plan (QIP)
- May 30: Submitted documentation of QIP

	Root Cause	Corrective Action
1	Our standards of conduct and related training are strength-based; specific prohibited behaviors are not explicitly identified.	Revised the Standard of Conduct to include prohibited behaviors.
2	Our interview questions and reference checks did not explicitly solicit information about prohibited behaviors.	Revised interview questions and reference checks to include screening for risk of prohibited behaviors.
3	Expectations for stopping and reporting prohibited behavior are not in our written procedures.	 Revised procedures to a. include requirement to intervene, stop, and report prohibited behaviors, and b. implement progressive discipline for failure to intervene, stop, and report prohibited behaviors.
4	Management considered incidents of prohibited behaviors as standalone rare events.	Revised monthly monitoring report and meeting to include discussion of trended aggregate incidents of abuse, neglect, and inappropriate conduct.

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


Child Care Bulletin 25-07 issued: May 6, 2025

Information: Provide guidance to County Health and Human Services Agencies (HHSAs) and Child Care and Development contractors administering the CalWORKs Stages One, Two, and Three Child Care Programs for families receiving CalWORKs Family Reunification (FR) services pursuant to Assembly Bill 135.

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Child Care Bulletin 25-13 issued: May 20, 2025

Subject: Guidance for Implementation of Assembly Bill 393 for Dual Language Learners

Information: Beginning July 1, 2025, Center Based CCTR contractors must collect data on the number of Dual Language Learners in the program and the language composition of program staff.

Action: This is currently required of all State preschoolers (CSPP). Staff will expand the collection of this data to include the CCTR children.

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Recommendation

CONSIDER accepting the monthly update on the activities and oversight of the County's Head Start Program and provide guidance, as recommended by the Employment and Human Services Director.
