

All data refers to Contra Costa County


Demographics¹

The Foreign-Born population grew from **262,426** in 2015 to **303,817** in 2023, a growth of **15.8**%

Most Common Countries of Origin (2019-2023)²









Age of Foreign-Born Population (2023)









Employment Status Comparison of U.S.-Born and Foreign-Born Populations (2019-2023)



The number of *employed foreign-born workers* has increased from ~ **111,000** in 2017 to ~ **126,000** in 2023, representing a **growth of 13.5**%

The number of *employed native workers* has increased from ~ **235,000** in 2017 to ~ **247,000** in 2023, representing a **growth of 5.1**%






Occupation of Foreign-Born Workforce (2023)







Inflation-Adjusted Earnings for Full-Time, Year-Round Foreign-Born Workers (2019 – 2023)





Educational Attainment for all Foreign-Born Populations (2019 – 2023)





U.S. Born and Foreign-Born Populations Below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (2023)













Years of US Residence of Undocumented Immigrants¹¹ (2019)








