<p>Knowledge: Have you learned about topics that the Contra Costa Hazardous Materials Commission addresses? If so, please share a few examples of topics you've previously learned.</p>	<p>Through my coursework in AP Environmental Science, I've gained a deeper understanding of the interactions between hazardous materials and ecosystems. One of the key areas we explored was how pollutants, particularly chemical waste, can affect water, air, and soil quality which aligns with the mission of the Contra Costa Hazardous Materials Commission to protect and promote the health, safety, and well-being of Contra Costa residents as they are affected by hazardous materials and hazardous waste. In my class we also discussed the importance of environmental policy in managing these materials to prevent harm to both human health and wildlife. For instance, I learned about the Clean Water Act, which regulates pollutants in U.S. waters, as well as the challenges associated with hazardous waste disposal. I also took AP Biology, where I developed an in-depth understanding of ecological systems and human impacts on the environment. After passing the AP Biology exam, I participated in a field trip to the Dutch Slough, where we studied wetlands restoration and how such efforts help combat environmental degradation. These lessons have taught me the need for responsible management of hazardous materials to mitigate their environmental impact.</p>

Please describe your involvement with any clubs, local organizations, projects, research assignments, volunteering, classes/coursework, etc. that addresses any environmental issues.</p>	<p>I've actively applied my knowledge of environmental issues through leadership in Healththeory, a youth-led nonprofit dedicated to uplifting the health of adversity-exposed communities through service and health education. I founded Healththeory as the first health-based service club at my school, where we raise awareness about the intersection of health and the environment, including how exposure to hazardous materials disproportionately affects low-income communities. In addition to my role in Healththeory, I had the opportunity to complete a 10-week research internship with a doctor, where we explored some environmental issues, deepening my understanding of their broader impact on public health. I also mentored a student in a research paper writing competition, where we won 2nd place, further developing my leadership and mentoring skills.</p>

	<p>Furthermore, I gained valuable marketing experience through an internship with Mind4Youth, where I created social media content about how the environment can influence people’s mental health to support their mission. In addition, I am a member of the Refresh Club, which focuses on helping the environment through initiatives like the Marsh Creek Clean-up and gardening days at my school. The Contra Costa HMC is responsible for not only the safety of citizens through the safe cleanup and disposal of hazardous materials at a moment's notice, along with this public service the HMC keeps tabs on any potential public safety issues such as when a fire had occurred at Martinez Renewables in 2023, where the HMC and other organizations worked to both quell the fire and evaluate the damages to the land and environment, along with publishing multiple reports, both within 3 days of the incident and many monthly follow-up reports and the final report which included details such as what, how much and where material was released, background on what the facility did, what happened, and more, all to ensure a safe community, free from hazardous waste and materials.
