I would like to represent EHSD on the Council on Homelessness. This is a topic that I am passionate about in both my personal and professional life. While working in Solano County, I managed multiple homeless housing programs from 2018 through January 2025. My primary program was the CalWORKs Housing Support Program (HSP), but my team was also responsible for Bringing Families Home (BFH), Housing & Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP) and Home Safe. In my personal life I volunteer with an organization in Oakland and help assemble and distribute food and hygiene kits to encampments throughout the city.

Describe your qualifications for this appointment. (NOTE: you may also include a copy of your resume with this application)

Starting in 2018, as a manager for Solano County Health and Social Services, I was responsible for managing the Housing Support Program (HSP) for CalWORKs families. The budget grew from \$1 million to \$3 million and as high as \$9 million with county redistribution funds. We were able to receive redistribution funds because we spent our allocation while other counties underspent. I had a team of social workers who not only located housing but also provided case management services to HSP and HDAP clients.

2. Please explain why you would like to serve on the Council on Homelessness and in the specific Council seat(s) you are applying for. (400 word maximum) *

I am a Human Services Division Manager with Contra Costa County Employment & Human Services Department (EHSD), and I would like to represent my agency on the Council. I have a longstanding passion for serving individuals and families experiencing homelessness. In 2018, while serving as a manager in Solano County, I was assigned to oversee a bureau that managed homeless programs for CalWORKs families, including Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH), Rapid Rehousing (RRH), the Housing Support Program (HSP), and the Bringing Families Home initiative for Child Welfare. Through this work, I quickly came to understand that effectively addressing homelessness requires collaboration across multiple teams and systems. My bureau worked closely with Fiscal staff to monitor spending on a monthly basis and partnered with Child Welfare to coordinate support for families referred to our programs. What I valued most about the Housing Support Program was the county's ability to tailor policies to meet client needs within the state's regulatory framework. For example, we had flexibility to adjust housing assistance amounts, establish payment schedules (e.g., 100%, 75%, 50%), and create policies for landlord incentives, loss mitigation, and unit retention. We also modified the length of program eligibility in alignment with available resources. These experiences reinforced the importance of creative, collaborative, and adaptive approaches in order to achieve lasting outcomes for vulnerable families.

3. Please briefly describe any personal or professional skills, experiences, volunteer work, or connections (such as affiliations with organizations addressing homelessness) that you would bring to the Council on Homelessness and/or the specific seat you are applying for. My experience with homeless programs began in 2018 working for Solano County Health & Social Services. As the Program Manager, and later the Administrator, I was closely involved at many levels including making policy decisions for the CalWORKs Housing Support Program (HSP), and Housing & Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP). In addition to these programs, my team also administered Bringing Families Home (BFH) and Home Safe for other divisions within the department. I closely monitored budgets and participated in regular meetings with county staff, CoC staff, CBOs, and landlords. HSP was the largest program I managed, we always spent our allocation and repeatedly received additional funds from county redistribution. The primary group I served was CalWORKs families (over 225 annually), followed by single adults served under HDAP. One of my proudest achievements was building relationships with landlords, one of whom dedicated his entire apartment complex to our HSP program because he felt strongly about the work we did. In my personal life I am a board member of a non-profit that provides job training and housing to single mothers in Alameda County. I also volunteer with the East Oakland Collective for an event called Feed the Hood; boots on the ground delivery of food and hygiene kits to those in encampments.

5. Unhoused people in Contra Costa County come from many different backgrounds in terms of race, ethnicity, culture, ability, age, sexual and gender identity, and immigration status. Please list and explain 3 reasons why certain groups might have a harder time accessing services than others. (400 words maximum) *

I believe that accessing services for any unhoused person or family is challenging, with many barriers to overcome. Here are three reasons why certain groups have a harder time.

1. Sexual and gender identity - In addition to family rejection, LGBTQ+ individuals experience higher rates of abuse and harassment in shelters. Transgender people may be assigned housing that doesn't align with their gender identity
2. Immigrants - they face barriers that may include language needs, especially if it is a language outside of threshold languages within the community. Typically, there will be services available in Spanish, but it can be more complicated beyond that. In the current political climate, immigrants have a lot of fear about asking for benefits or services, even if they are documented. As we continue to witness on the news, no one seems to be immune from being profiled and plucked off of the street for what our government has perceived is the crime of being foreign born. Fear is one of their biggest challenges.
3. People with disabilities - this likely also includes a large number of elderly as well. Their challenges include accessing services and/or housing that can accommodate their disabilities and accompanying equipment. Often this group may be limited to locating housing on first floor levels which limits available inventory.

6. Please share and explain two (2) ideas to help Contra Costa County better support people who are unhoused and people at risk of being unhoused. Your ideas can come from your own experience receiving services, your work, and/or what you've seen in the news. (400 word maximum) *

1. In Solano County, we met with the local Board of Realtors to promote the HSP program. We developed brochures and a power point presentation with an overview of the program. Some of the people in the room were current HSP landlords who voluntarily gave testimonials about their experience with the county and the HSP program.
2. I am still new to returning to Contra Costa County after a 13-yr absence. I think it's imperative to listen to those with lived experience. What helped them overcome homelessness? What were barriers to getting housed and how could we have been more helpful? I think it's much easier to prevent homelessness than to try to get housed, is Contra Costa giving priority to prevention?
