- 1. Please explain your treatment model for the Langley Porter in patient psych unit
- 2. How do you think this model could be integrated into the new in-patient treatment centers that are going to be funded by Prop 1, to provide updated care for patients admitted to these new units.
- 3. Considering that a growing population of IST (Incompetent to Stand Trial) Misdemeanor and IST Felony patients might be the majority of ones who are utilizing these new care facilities, how could your model (Langley-Porter) be helpful to those therapists and Psychiatrists staffing these units.
- 4. Do you see residents and interns working more in the Detention health services to assist in what is now the largest provider of mental health in counties?
- 5. Is there any way you know that a portion of the Prop 1 funds could be identified to train and fund more Psychologist and MFT programs to increase the number of therapists who graduate yearly.

#### Proposed revisions to the Mental Health Commission (MHC) By-law changes

Proposed Changes to Contra Costa County Mental Health Commission Bylaws

For Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors Approval

#### Section 2. Attendance

#### 2.1 Attendance requirements:

- a) Regular attendance of Commission meetings is mandatory for all Commission membersCommissioners.
  - 1. Unexcused Absences:

A <u>Commission memberCommissioner</u> is required to contact the Commission Chairperson and the administrative assistant at least 24 hours before a regularly scheduled meeting if they are unable to attend. Failure to do so will result in an unexcused absence <u>unless the absence is excused</u>. A <u>Commission memberCommissioner</u> who has four (4) unexcused absences from a regularly scheduled full commission meeting in any consecutive twelve-month period, as opposed to calendar year, will be deemed to have automatically resigned from the Commission. In such event, the <u>CommissionmemberCommissioner</u>'s status will be noted at the next Commission meeting and recorded in the meeting minutes. The Commission Chairperson shall, without further direction from the Commission, apprise the appointing Supervisor and request the Board of Supervisors to remove the appointee and request the appointment of a replacement.

2. Excused Absences:

A <u>Commission memberCommissioner</u>'s absence from a regularly scheduled Commission meeting may be excused <u>due to various circumstances</u> <u>including to include</u> but not limited to <u>absences due to</u> major illness, <u>-and</u> <u>unexpected family emergencies</u>, <u>surgical procedures</u>, <u>jury duty, funerals</u>, <u>and other similar events</u>. -They <u>may</u> also include some <del>un</del>scheduled absences, such as <del>surgical procedures</del>, jury duty, funerals, and <u>scheduledpre-planned</u> vacations <u>and appointments</u>. <u>Commission</u> <u>memberCommissioner</u>s shall obtain consent from the Commission Chairperson at least <u>one day24 hours</u> prior to the meeting for any planned absences. Excused absences will be recorded in the meeting minutes as an "excused absence."

3. Leave of Absence:

A <u>Commission memberCommissioner</u> who does not wish to resign and needs a leave from the Commission commitments may request a leave of absence for illness or personal reasons for a period of up to three (3) months. The request must be submitted in writing to the Commission Chairperson, who will inform the appointing Supervisor. A <u>Commission memberCommissioner</u> may request an extension to their leave by submitting a request in writing to the Commission Chairperson, who will forward the request to the appointing Supervisor for approval.
