Multiagency Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC)

WIC §749.22

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- ▶ *Statutory Requirements of the JJCC*
 - ▶ Develop and implement a continuum of county-based responses to juvenile crime
 - ▶ Annual Consolidated Plan
 - ▶ Annual Expenditure & Data Report
- ▶ *Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act Fund (JJCPA) (Government Code Sections §§ 30061(b)(4)(A) & (B))*
 - ▶ JJCPA funds can be used for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency and addressing juvenile crime for any elements of response to juvenile crime and delinquency, including prevention, intervention, suppression, and incapacitation.
- ▶ *Youthful Offender Block Grant (YOBG) (Welfare and Institution Code Sections §§1950 and 1951(b).)*
 - ▶ YOBG funding is to enhance the capacity of local communities to implement an effective continuum of response to juvenile crime and delinquency. These funds can be used to enhance the capacity of county probation, mental health, drug and alcohol, and other county departments to provide appropriate rehabilitative and supervision services to youth offenders supervised locally.

 - ▶ Sheriff's Office representative

 - ▶ Employment and Human Services Department representative
 - ▶ Behavioral Health Services representative
 - ▶ Alcohol and Other Drugs Division representative
 - ▶ Public Health representative
- ▶ *Eleven (11) Additional Members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors, as follows:*
 - ▶ City Police Department representative (rotates between Richmond, Antioch, Concord & Pittsburg)
 - ▶ County Office of Education or a School District representative
 - ▶ Juvenile Justice Commission Chair*
 - ▶ Four (4) At-Large community members, residing or working within County of Contra Costa
 - ▶ Two (2) At-Large non-profit organization representatives
 - ▶ Two (2) At-Large youth, fourteen to twenty-five years old and residing or working within County of Contra Costa

Framing Question: How can Contra Costa County develop a continuum of equity-informed services that prevent juvenile justice system involvement and place youth in the least restrictive environment possible consistent with the needs of the youth and public safety?

Guiding Question 1:

What are the number and characteristics of youth who have contact with law enforcement in Contra Costa County, what was the outcome of their contact, and to what extent are those outcomes equitable by race?

Guiding Question 2:

What are the top needs of youth with law enforcement contact and at risk of law enforcement contact, and to what extent are services available to meet these needs?

Guiding Question 3:

To what extent are service providers delivering programs that are cost effective and achieve positive outcomes?

DJJ Realignment Planning Subcommittee

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- DIVISION OF JUVENILE JUSTICE REALIGNMENT (WIC § §1991-1995)
 - “...counties shall create a subcommittee of the multiagency juvenile justice coordinating council to develop a plan describing the facilities, programs, placements, services, supervision and reentry strategies that are needed to provide appropriate rehabilitative services for realigned youth.”
 - Meets a minimum of twice annually
 - Develops and Submits the Juvenile Justice Realignment Block Grant Plan

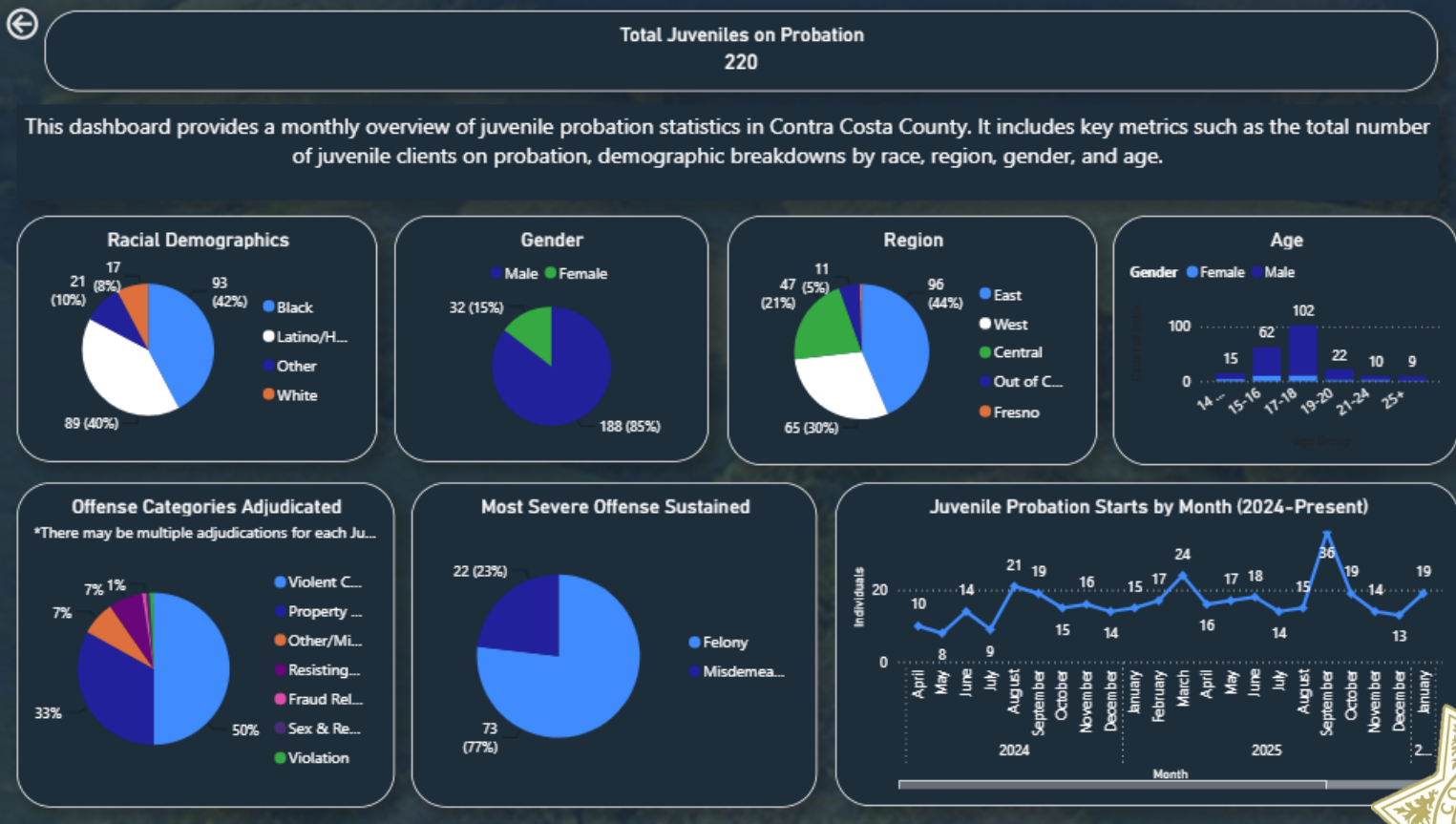
