LOCAL PRIMACY AGENCY COUNTIES



1976 | US EPA delegates primacy to CA

1992 | Local Primacy Agency (LPA) agreements est.

1996 | Contra Costa Co. enters first LPA agreement

2013 | Latest Contra Costa LPA agreement

2017 | Amended Contra Costa LPA agreement

Overview

LPA Systems

15 – 199 service connections

- Public water systems
- Delegated regulatory authority from State Water Board
- More reporting & regulatory requirements
- **75** total systems in CCC

Small Water Systems

2 – 199 service connections

Non-LPA Systems

2 – 14 service connections


- Non-public water systems
- Regulated under local Health Officer authority
- Less reporting & regulatory requirements
- 34 total systems in CCC


Types of LPA Small Water Systems

Community Water Systems

- A public water system that serves at least 15 service connections used by yearlong residents OR serves at least 25 yearlong residents of the area served by the system
 - > apartments & condominiums
 - rural mobile home parks
 - ➤ large residential subdivisions
- Total # in Contra Costa = 28





Types of LPA Small Water Systems

Transient, Non-Community Water Systems

- A non-community water system that does not regularly serve at least 25 of the same persons over six months per year
 - > rural gas stations & restaurants
 - > campgrounds
 - > marinas
 - > churches
- Total # in Contra Costa = 42



Non-Transient, Non-Community Water Systems

- A public water system that is not a CWS
 AND that regularly serves at least 25 of
 the same persons over six months per
 year.
 - > rural schools
 - > office buildings
 - > industrial buildings
 - businesses
- Total # in Contra Costa = 5



Types of Non-LPA Small Water Systems

Local Small Water Systems

- A non-public water system that serves between 2-4 service connections AND does not regularly serve drinking water to more than an average of 25 individuals daily for more than 60 days per year
 - > 2-4 parcels sharing a water source
- Total # in Contra Costa = 20



State Small Water Systems

- A non-public system that serves at least
 5, but not more than 14, service
 connections AND does not regularly
 serve drinking water to more than an
 average of 25 individuals daily for more
 than 60 days per year
 - > small subdivision
- Total # in Contra Costa = 14

Staff Recommendations





County Local Primacy Delegation Agreement no later than February 28, 2026, returning the regulatory oversight of the delegated small public water systems back to the State Water Resources Control Board.

ADOPT an **amendment** to the Env Health Division fee schedule **adjusting** SWS Program **non-public water system regulatory fees**.

- Local Small Water Systems: \$474
- State Small Water Systems: \$910

Next Steps



OPEN the public hearing regarding the adoption of the proposed fees charged by EH Division Small Water Systems Program; RECEIVE testimony, public comments, and any objections to the resolution; and CLOSE the public hearing.



CONSIDER staff's presentation, all testimony, public comments, objections, staff report, NBS Fee Study Appendix A.6, and all other testimony and materials presented to the Board prior to the close of the public hearing.



ADOPT the proposed fees adjusting non-public Small Water Systems Program regulatory fees charged by EH Division, effective September 16, 2025.



DIRECT staff to terminate the Contra Costa County Local Primacy Delegation Agreement returning regulatory oversight of delegated small public water systems back to the State Water Resources Control Board.
