

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Center Enrollment Rates






Current Slot Allotments:

- Federal Slots (Head Start) = 1,201 (1,201 filled slots as of October 2025)
- State Slots (CDE and CDSS) = 764 (686 filled slots as of October 2025)
- Total Unique Slots = 1,345 (1,318 filled slots as of October 2025)


Current Enrollment Requirements:

- Federally Funded = 97% slots filled
- State Funded = Currently "hold harmless" meaning no penalties for not filling all slots. When "hold harmless" ends in June 2026, we will no longer be funded for unfilled slots.

Center Attendance Rates




Average Center Meals & Snacks Per Day

Contract with vendor (Ordo, Inc.) began August 1, 2025 following Board approval on July 22, 2025 (C31)

Working with vendor to address initial challenges such as ensuring all meals and snacks are prepared daily, meeting federal requirements for meal components, and quality of meals



Program Information Report (PIR) Overview

Federal Requirement: Head Start Act Sec. 642 (d)(2)(I) – Each Head Start agency shall ensure the sharing of accurate and regular information for use by the governing body and the policy council [...] the program information reports.

Timing: Data submitted August 29, 2025 (ahead of August 31, 2025 deadline) for program operations from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025 (FY24-25)

Purpose: Not a compliance or monitoring tool for individual programs. Data is used at state and national levels to share information about Head Start with members of Congress.

• Note – Usually state and national comparative data are available by now but were not released by the Office of Head Start prior to the government shutdown and are yet to be released.





PIR: Cumulative Child Enrollment




Cumulative enrollment is a count of all children who received services for any amount of time during the program year.


PIR: Pregnant Women Enrollment



PIR: Languages Spoken




PIR: Health Services









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November 2025 Policy Council Actions


The Head Start Policy Council convened on November 19, 2025. Key actions included:

- No recommended actions for the Board of Supervisors

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

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
OHS FY26 Federal Monitoring Review

Notified on November 21, 2025 our scheduled Focus Area 1 (FA1) review starting Monday January 5, 2026.



Health and Safety Compliance



Unusual Incidents & Citations



Reportable incidents as defined by the Office of Head Start (OHS)

OHS considers a "significant incident" to be any incident that results in serious injury or harm to a child, violates Head Start standards of conduct at 45 CFR §1302.90(c), or results in a child being left alone, unsupervised, or released to an unauthorized adult. A program must report all significant incidents affecting the health and safety of children with 7 days.

California Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing Citations

<u>Type A:</u> An immediate risk to the health, safety or personal rights of children in care.

Type B: If not corrected right away, may be a risk to the health, safety, and personal rights of the children in care.

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Child Care Bulletin 25-30 issued: November 26, 2025

Subject: Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Overview

Information: Provides an overview to counties and child care and development contractors of the provisions that may affect program operations, contractor responsibilities, and provider communications in the Agreement between the State of California and Child Care Providers United (CCPU) that was ratified on September 22, 2025. The MOU is in effect until July 1, 2028.

Action: No action needed for this specific CCB. See related CCBs and MBs for staff actions such as updating partner contracts and distributing one-time payments.





Child Care Bulletin 25-28 issued: November 13, 2025

Subject: One-Time Per-Child Stabilization Payments to Care Providers Pursuant to Senate Bill (SB) 151

Information: Provides guidance to counties and child care and development contractors of the distribution of one-time per-child provider stabilization payments to child care providers who were reimbursed for state-subsidized child care services in the month of April 2025. This applies for our CalWORKs Stage 2, California Alternative Payment Program (CAPP) programs, and state-funded preschool program (CCTR). This follows an agreement between the State and the Child Care Providers United (CCPU) and is an out-of-contract allocation.

Action: We received a warrant for \$662,373 on October 24, 2025. We are in the process of distributing to CalWORKs Stage 2 and CAPP providers. Staff are preparing to request Board of Supervisors approval to pay CCTR subcontractors (partners).

Child Care Bulletin 25-29 issued: November 21, 2025

Subject: Cost of Care Plus Rate Payments to Child Care Providers Pursuant to Senate Bill 151

Information: Provides guidance to counties and child care development contractors of the continuation of the per-child, monthly cost of care plus payments and the one-time per-child payments issued to family child care providers pursuant to Senate Bill (SB) 151. This applies for our CalWORKs Stage 2, California Alternative Payment Program (CAPP) programs, and state-funded preschool program (CCTR).

Action: No action needed.

CDE Management Bulletin 25-11

Management Bulletin 25-11 issued: November 20, 2025

Subject: California State Preschool Program Cost of Care Plus Rate Allocations and One-Time Stabilization Payments for Family Childcare Providers and Centers

Information: Provides guidance to California State Preschool Program (CSPP) contractors on the Cost of Care Plus Rate allocations and one-time stabilization payments. Similar to guidance from CDSS, the per-child rate for Contra Costa County is \$230. There is also a one-time stabilization payment for providers and centers of \$431 per child based on CSPP enrollment in April 2025. Contractors will also receive 5% allocation to cover administrative costs associated with distributing these payments. Payments should be distributed by 1/1/2026.

Action: Staff are preparing to request Board of Supervisors approval to pay CSPP subcontractors (partners).

Child Care Bulletin 25-32 issued: November 21, 2025

Subject: Requirements Regarding Technology and System Improvements Noticing and Provider Information Packet Distribution New Memorandum of Understanding Provisions: Technology Improvement, and Provider Information Packet

Information: Guides contractors and other impacted groups in implementing new processes related to system improvements, payment procedures, and provider communications. The goal is to support the effective and timely implementation of the MOU without causing disruption to normal business operations.

Action: No action needed at this time. Staff will follow guidance on distributing information to new and existing family child care home providers when issued by the State.

Child Care Bulletin 25-27 issued: October 27, 2025

Subject: Processing Late Attendance Records or Invoices

Information: Provides information and guidance to counties and child care contractors when processing late attendance records or invoices from providers. This applies for our CalWORKs Stage 2 and California Alternative Payment Program (CAPP) programs. Assuming funds are still available in the contract, if a provider submits an attendance record or billing invoice, contractors have until September 30 of the year in which their contract expires to submit revised prior years fiscal reports. An exception to this would be if an attendance record or invoice is submitted outside of the five-year retention policy.

Action: Staff are updating procedures to align with the timelines outlined in WIC section 10227.5(d).





Child Care Bulletin 25-31 issued: November 19, 2025

Subject: Clarification on the Business Relationship Between the State and Family Child Care Providers

Information: Provides counties and contractors with clarification regarding the business relationship between the State and family child care providers. Family child care providers are not public employees and do not have an employer-employee relationship with the State, agencies or departments of the State, political subdivisions of the State (including counties), or contractors or subcontractors administering state-funded early care and education programs (including Alternative Payment Program agencies).

Action: No action needed.



CDE Management Bulletin 25-10

Management Bulletin 25-10 issued: November 18, 2025

Subject: Support to California State Preschool Program (CSPP) Contractors on the Set Aside and Serving Children with Disabilities

Information: Reminds CSPP contractors of the enrollment requirement set aside for children with disabilities (5%), requirement that children with disabilities be educated in the least restrictive environment, annual data reporting for children with disabilities, and allowances for spending CSPP contract funds for children with disabilities.

Action: No action needed. We already meet this requirement.

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Recommendation

CONSIDER accepting the monthly update on the activities and oversight of the County's Head Start Program and provide guidance, as recommended by the Employment and Human Services Director; and

APPROVE the FY23-24 Single Audit findings related to Head Start.
