2. Public Comment:

- Concerns raised about ongoing speeding and motorcycle activity on Marsh Drive.
- Suggestions included installing cameras and radar signs.
- Residents expressed frustration with continued illegal fireworks and a recent fire incident involving a palm tree.
- Discussion about ongoing issues with unhoused individuals near the mobile home park and community concerns about fairness and safety.

3. Approval of Agenda and Minutes:

- Motion made and seconded to approve the agenda.
- Minutes from the June 11th meeting were approved with minor corrections noted by Councilmember Shawn.

4. Agency Reports:

Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office:

- Provided updates on coordinated enforcement efforts to address traffic violations using motor units from contract cities.
- Fireworks enforcement concentrated in high-priority areas such as Vine Hill due to prior violence and fires.

- Confirmed ongoing challenges with illegal dumping, encampments, and jurisdictional coordination.

Community Concerns Discussed with Sheriff:

- Safety issues related to an encampment near Sun Valley with residents living in vehicles and BBQ setups.
- Personal anecdotes shared highlighting systemic housing issues and eviction experiences.
- Request for consistent enforcement balanced with empathy for displaced residents.

5. District 5 Office Report

- Brandon Evans announced his departure from the district 5 office at the end of July to run for Richmond City Council and to assume a CEO position at a reentry/workforce nonprofit.
- Armando will serve as the new representative for Pacheco MAC.
- Updates provided on:
 - October 25th Community Clean-Up event (9 AM–12 PM)
 - o Rummage Sale scheduled for October 18th
 - Community Benefits Advisory Panel: Two seats remain unfilled for Vine Hill; five of seven will be seated soon.
 - Newsletter, social media, and physical postings are being used to promote vacancies.

Project Updates:

- Ongoing Marsh Drive improvements planned, including restriping and visibility enhancements.
- Continued beautification work by Special Districts (tree replacement and maintenance).
- Plans for Amazon-related development near the airport discussed, with concerns about traffic impacts.
