I chose the top boards/commissions I believe I would serve best on. Here are my reasonings for each:

Alcohol and Other Drugs Advisory Board I am passionate about contributing to the betterment of my community and am eager to serve on the Contra Costa County Alcohol and Other Drugs Advisory Board because I strongly align with its mission of assessing community needs and advocating for solutions to alcohol and drug-related problems. I've gained experience working with nonprofits and leading community-focused initiatives, and have learned the importance of prevention, treatment, and support for those affected by substance use - no matter their age. Also, I previously lived in a dangerous neighborhood in San Jose where drugs were prevalent. I watched my best friend almost die of overdose, and ever since then I've been a passionate advocate for drug prevention and treatment. I want to use my experiences and dedication to make a meaningful difference on this board.

Mental Health Commission/ Behavioral Health Board Here's what sparked my interest in mental health: As mentioned in the previous response, I used to live in an underserved community in San Jose with many issues, the majority being social issues (violence, drugs, & poverty) - these were the issues I noticed people focused on improving. Many people I knew in the neighborhood were always down and seemed "off" to me, and I started to realize it's because they have so many issues from all the trauma they've been through, and there is no one for them. Sadly, even many of the children I met don't have anyone to talk to - especially not their parents. In fact, one of my neighbors was my best friend and I'd watch her get abused by her father on a daily basis, and it definitely played a huge toll on her mental health. She started to feel lonely and depressed, and I was the only one there for her. I started to think of ways I can help, so I learned more about mental health career possibilities. I then created a group chat for the neighborhood where people can talk about their issues in a safe place, and the chat currently has around 5k people. Inspired, I decided to create a nonprofit to help people with common mental health issues such as loneliness and depression, so I worked towards that and it turned out to be a success. I partnered with local businesses focusing on mental health, and together we worked to help empower more people and improve their mental health. Additionally, my grandfather has struggled with depression, and it's taught me of the challenges people living with mental health issues face. All my experiences and my work I've done with founding the nonprofit Make Choice has fueled my desire to advocate for more effective treatment options, greater awareness, and the elimination of the stigma surrounding mental health. I believe that serving on this commission would provide me with the opportunity to make a tangible impact by shaping policies and recommendations that improve the lives of individuals dealing with mental health challenges. I am committed to using my personal experiences, nonprofit work, and passion for advocacy to contribute to the Mental Health Commission's mission and make a meaningful difference in my community."

Public Law Library Board of Trustees I am deeply passionate about the law and public service, and I am eager to serve on the Law Library Board of Trustees to help ensure that legal resources are accessible to all members of the community. Through my work at a law firm in Pleasant Hill, I've learned the importance of legal research and the vital role that law libraries play in providing attorneys, law students, and the public with the tools they need to navigate legal matters. As someone aspiring to attend Georgetown Law School, I understand the need for comprehensive, up-to-date legal resources that support legal education and practice. Serving on this board would allow me to contribute to the development of those resources, while also broadening my knowledge of library governance and how public legal services are managed. I believe my experience working closely with lawyers and my dedication to the legal field will enable me to make an impact to the law library and support its mission to foster legal literacy and access to justice.

This experience aligns closely with the missions of the Alcohol and Other Drugs Advisory Board and the Mental Health Commission, where I would be able to use my skills to advocate for prevention, treatment, and support for individuals dealing with substance abuse and mental health challenges. Additionally, my commitment to pursuing a career in law, specifically my goal of becoming Attorney General, fuels my desire to contribute to the Public Law Library Board of Trustees. I am pleased to apply to each of these boards given their focus on identifying community-level needs and services to improve behavioral health and stable housing. I leave myself open to being considered for a seat on any of the selected boards. I have personal and family experience with homelessness, mental illness, and alcohol abuse. More specifically, I have a history of clinical depression, anxiety, and anorexia nervosa, and I have received extensive treatment at the outpatient, partial hospitalization, and inpatient levels, both in and out of state. I have received care from clinicians in private practice, through major academic institutions, such as UCSF and Stanford Psychiatry Departments, and from county services, such as John George Psychiatric Hospital. Since 2022, I have worked very hard to improve my wellbeing and achieve behavioral stability. Mine has been a chronic course, and I have been exposed to other patients—from diverse populations, managing various medical and behavioral diagnosis, and with diverse economic means to receive care—which has enriched my perspective of the systemic barriers, gaps, and strengths of our local mental health system. These lived experiences have given me specific, in-depth exposure to patient perspectives; what treatment options are viable given our current options for care within the context of our managed healthcare system. I have been disabled through Social Security (I am currently on a trial work period) and receive Medicare and Medi-Cal through Contra Costa. Throughout my life, from childhood to present, I have had several health plans: third-party private employer insurance; state-based plans; healthcare through higher education; and HMOs, PPOs, and federal fee-for-service plans. Being a member of each of these plans has provided insight into issues of access, exclusion, and the affordances of evidence-based care. My mother struggles with severe and enduring psychiatric illness and is permanently disabled. Her illnesses include epilepsy, anorexia nervosa, chronic pain, impaired neuropsychiatric and cognitive functioning, and a history of alcohol abuse, the latter of which is in remission. I am her primary caretaker; outside of my job, I take her to appointments several times per week and support her by clarifying medical discourse, her treatment options, and day-to-day functioning. I offer this detailed view of my background as a material context that motivates my application. I care deeply about identifying viable interventions for improving our healthcare system, and I am also aware of where certain strengths exist—for instance, the robust care offered through Contra Costa Health Plan. I am also excited at the possibility to learn more about these issues from board members with professional experience. I believe a board with diverse views—gender, race, economic background, sexual orientation, family status and social functioning, educational attainment—improves our system's ability to tap into how and where we can improve our community. Local intervention is essential. I identify as a gay, disabled male and first-generation college student. And my mother and I have previously been homeless for over a year when I was in high school. From 2009-10, we lived in her car. I draw on this first-hand experience to better understand and appreciate current discourse on housing, as well as understanding the entanglements between income status, educational attainment, family and social support, and how these factors can be either protective factors or vulnerabilities for medical and psychiatric illness. These factors are also predictive of recovery. I continue to read scholarship on the social determinants of health to better understand needs and services and what possibilities are viable. Collective effort is imperative for future wellbeing.
