

Community Advisory Board (CAB)

Applicant Expectations

The Community Advisory Board (CAB) seeks dedicated individuals committed to making positive contributions to the safety, well-being, and successful reintegration of community members impacted by the criminal justice system. Before becoming official members, applicants are expected to demonstrate the following:

1. Commitment to Public Safety and Reentry Efforts

Applicants should show a sincere interest and dedication to advancing public safety and supporting reentry initiatives that promote successful community reintegration.

2. Availability and Participation

Applicants must be willing to attend monthly meetings and actively engage in CAB discussions and activities. Members are expected to:

1. Attend monthly board meetings and participate in a subcommittee (approximately 5–7 hours per month, total).
2. Review meeting materials in advance.
3. Attend the annual retreat and occasional community events (approximately 8–10 hours per year, total).
4. Commit to a 3-year term and attend at least half of the CCP meetings.

3. Willingness to Learn

Applicants should demonstrate an openness to learning about AB 109, realignment policies, and other related criminal justice topics to effectively contribute to CAB's mission.

4. Collaboration and Respect

Applicants are expected to work collaboratively with diverse community members, agencies, and stakeholders, respecting differing viewpoints and promoting inclusive dialogue.

5. Integrity and Confidentiality

Applicants must commit to maintaining professionalism, confidentiality, and ethical standards in all CAB-related matters.

6. Active Engagement

Applicants should be prepared to contribute thoughtfully during meetings,

committees, and community initiatives, providing constructive input that advances CAB goals.

7. **Term Commitment**

Applicants must understand the expectations around serving a full term and the responsibilities associated with membership, including committee participation and project involvement.
