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Hello, my name is Dick Offerman and I live in Pleasant Hill. I would like to have the following letter entered into the record for today's Equity Committee meeting. Thanks

I am asking that our County go back to the original plan for an ICE non-cooperation ordinance. As you finished the Committee's March meeting, you stated that an ordinance would be discussed in the future.

Ordinance or policy, we just want our County to end all county cooperation with ICE that is not mandated by law. I also want our County to fully and permanently withdraw from the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program, SCAAP.

Each time someone is booked into the county jail, the detainee is fingerprinted. ICE can access these and if interested, ICE then sends an I-247 form to the sheriff's office requesting Name, DOB, Country of origin and the inmate's release date. While under no legal obligation, if the Sheriff responds, they can apply to get a SCAAP bounty, \$1,000 per detainee. That is too much cooperation with ICE by our county.

Today you provided us with a listing of other County's positions on policies versus ordinances. I have to say, I welcome your suggestion here, that we follow the lead of other counties, say like Marin County.

Marin County announced this Spring that they not taking SCAAP bounties anymore. Over three years, their Sheriff's Office received over \$1.2 million via ICE's SCAAP funds for reporting over 1,000 immigrants to ICE.

Now Marin now says **no to ICE's bounty**. Please follow their strong leadership and that of San Francisco, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Napa and San Mateo Counties.
