*Katrina Natale, Human Trafficking Task Force Director, provided an overview of the countywide public outreach campaign on human trafficking mission, membership, objectives and provided examples of client outcomes. They have adopted an enhanced collaborative model with greater focus on outreach as aligned with their strategic plan and goals. Outreach goals prioritize prevention through raising awareness and early interventions, identification of services and reporting, supporting survivors by*

*connecting them to expert services, and accountability measures that educate potential buyers and business and prosecute exploiters.*

*Vice Chair Andersen shared gratitude for the expanded outreach efforts and suggested Katrina reach out to Emlyn Struthers to identify areas where human trafficking advocacy falls within the County's legislative and advocacy platforms, so that the Board can formally support these outreach efforts.*

*Enid Mendoza, Senior Deputy County Administrator and staff to the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP), presented the details of the fiscal year 2026-27 Community Corrections budget and responded to questions regarding the status of the fund's reserve. The current CCP budget policy requires a fund reserve of 50% of the budgeted expenditures.*

*The Committee approved the budget as proposed for inclusion in the countywide FY 2026-27 Recommended Budget and requested to have the Community Corrections Partnership return to the Committee with proposed revisions to its budget and reserve policy that align better with recent revenue trends. The Committee mentioned lowering the fund reserve to 30% of budgeted expenditures or another data informed threshold should be considered to ensure ongoing service needs are met rather than building a reserve much greater than needed to offset funding fluctuations.*

The Committee also requested having the Community Warning System presentation sooner than later on the calendar.*

*The Committee agreed with staff's recommendation to cancel a couple of meetings due to the lower number of referrals, and the Committee determined to not meet in July or December, as long as no business matters of the PPC were necessary for discussion during those months.*
