**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANTIOCH

WHEREAS, under the Federal Clean Water Act, prescribed discharges of stormwater require a permit from the appropriate California Regional Water Quality Control Board under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") program;

WHEREAS, the City of Antioch ("City") applied for, and received, an NPDES permit which requires the implementation of selected Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from entering stormwaters;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City to utilize funds received from its Stormwater Utility Area ("SUA") for implementation of the NPDES program and drainage maintenance activities;

WHEREAS, at the request of the City, the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District ("District") has completed the process for formation of an SUA, including the adoption of the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs Payment agreement between City and District requires the City, by April 1st, to determine the rate to be assessed per Equivalent Runoff Unit for the forthcoming fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Antioch hereby determines that the rate to be set at twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per Equivalent Runoff Unit for Fiscal Year 2026/27.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council hereby requests the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District adopt and levy Stormwater Utility Assessments based on the rate of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per Equivalent Runoff Unit for Fiscal Year 2026/27.

**THE CITY COUNCIL
City of Clayton, California**

WHEREAS, under the Federal Water Quality Act [33 U.S.C. Section 1342 (p)], certain municipal stormwater discharges require a permit from the appropriate federal or state authorities pursuant to the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clayton, in conjunction with other affected jurisdictions within Contra Costa County, applied to the State Regional Water Quality Control Board and received a Joint NPDES Permit which requires the implementation of a Stonn Water Management Plan and Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from entering stormwaters; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 2768 (West's Water Code Appendix, Section 63-12 and 63-12.9) authorizes the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) to establish Stormwater Utility Areas (SUA) and to levy annual benefit assessments for the purpose of carrying out activities required under the NPDES program; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Clayton to utilize funds received from its Stormwater Utility Area (SUA) for implementation of the NPDES program and local drainage maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the City of Clayton, the Contra Costa County Flood Control District and Water Conservation District (District) has completed the process for the formation of a SUA, including the adoption of the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs payment agreement between the City and the District requires that the City of Clayton annually, by April 1, determine its rate to be assigned to a single ERU for the forthcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 9-93, which established the range of the annual assessment to be imposed by the District within the storm water utility area not to exceed \$29 per ERU; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clayton has operated at its maximum \$29 per ERU rate since FY 1999/00 (the last twenty-seven fiscal years) and this same rate is proposed again for FY 2026/2027.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the City Council of Clayton, California does hereby determine that its real property assessment rate to be assigned to a single ERU for FY 2026/2027 shall be set and assessed at \$29.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the City Council of Clayton, California, does hereby request the Contra Costa Flood Control and Water Conservation District to adopt the SUA levies in the City of Clayton based on the above established rate

Establish an Annual Parcel Assessment for Fiscal
Year 2026-27 for Drainage Maintenance and National
Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)
Program**

Resolution No. 26-5

WHEREAS, under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, [33 U.S.C. Section 1342(p)], certain municipal storm water discharges require a permit from the appropriate federal or state authorities pursuant to the National Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Concord, in conjunction with other affected jurisdictions within Contra Costa County, applied to the State Regional Water Quality Control Board and received a Joint NPDES Permit to discharge storm water and developed a Storm Water Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 2768 (West's Water Code Appendix, Section 63-12 and 63-12.9) authorizes the Contra Costa Flood Control and Water Conservation District (DISTRICT) to establish storm water utility areas and to impose annual benefit assessments for the purpose of carrying out the activities required under the NPDES Program; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has completed the process for formation of a Concord Storm Water Utility Area (SUA), including the adoption of Storm Water Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs Payment Agreement between the City of Concord and DISTRICT requires the City of Concord annually to determine the rate to be assessed per Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for the forthcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 93-14, which established the range of annual assessment to be imposed by the DISTRICT within the storm water utility area at an amount not to exceed \$35 per ERU.

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**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONCORD DOES
RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970, Public Resources Code Section 21000, et. seq., as amended and implementing State CEQA Guidelines, Title 14, Chapter 3 of the California Code of Regulations (collectively "CEQA"), establishing the annual amount of and authorizing the Contra Costa County Flood Control & Water Conservation District to adopt SUA levies and/or assess ERUs does not constitute a "project," within the meaning of Public Resources Code Section 21065, CEQA Guidelines Sections 15060(c), and/or 15378, because it does not have the potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment. Even if this action did constitute a "project" under CEQA, it falls within the "common sense" exemption set forth in CEQA Guidelines . Section 15061(b)(3), excluding projects where "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment...", and is statutorily exempt pursuant to Section 15273 of the CEQA Guidelines because it is establishing charges for the purpose of meeting operating expenses. Accordingly, no further environmental review is warranted. This determination reflects the City's independent judgement and analysis.

Section 2. The annual assessment imposed by the DISTRICT within the storm water utility area for Fiscal Year 2026-27 shall be \$35.00 per Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU).

Section 3. The City Council requests the DISTRICT to adopt storm water utility area levies based on said amount per ERU.

Section 4. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.





RESOLUTION NO. 12-2026

AUTHORIZING THE CONTRA COSTA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO ADOPT THE FISCAL YEAR 2026/27 FEE FOR THE TOWN OF DANVILLE STORMWATER UTILITY AREA

WHEREAS, the Federal Water Pollution Control Act requires dischargers of stormwater to obtain a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit from the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board; and

WHEREAS, Danville, the Contra Costa County cities, the County, and the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District have joined under the Contra Costa Clean Water Program to secure the required NPDES permit; and

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted NPDES Permit No. CAS612008 to develop a Municipal Regional Permit that applies to all nine Bay Area Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Town complies with the NPDES permit requirements by operating a local Clean Water Program, participating in the Contra Costa Clean Water Program and implementing Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from stormwater; and

WHEREAS, in 1993 the funding necessary to implement this permit was established at a range of \$22 to \$30 per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) through the Stormwater Utility Assessment (Town of Danville Resolution No. 24-93); and

WHEREAS, said assessment rate must be set each year by the Town Council; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council appoints the City Engineer, or his/her designee, as its official representative to the Contra Costa Clean Water Program; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council wishes to continue to participate in the Contra Costa Clean Water Program and continue to fund the program through the assessment of individual properties; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Danville Town Council authorizes continuance of the Stormwater Utility Assessment to be set at \$30 per ERU for all properties within Danville.

WHEREAS, at the request of the City of El Cerrito, the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) has completed the process for formation of a Stormwater Utility Area (SUA), including the adoption of the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of El Cerrito to utilize funds received from its SUA for implementation of the NPDES program and drainage maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs Payment Agreement between the City of El Cerrito and the District requires that the City of El Cerrito annually determine the rate to be assessed to a single Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for the forthcoming fiscal year and the District has requested the approved resolutions by March 31, 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of El Cerrito does determine that the rate to be assigned to a single ERU for Fiscal Year 2026-27 shall be set at \$38.00.

WHEREAS, the District established Stormwater Utility Areas under Contra Costa County's Stormwater Utility Assessment (SUA) Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA agreement between the City of Pinole and the District requires the City to determine the annual SUA rate in its Stormwater Utility Area; and

WHEREAS, the SUA rate is based on the Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU); and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Pinole to utilize funds received from its SUA for complying with the NPDES permit conditions (MRP 2.0 and MRP 3.0), preventing stormwater pollution and performing drainage system maintenance activities.



Report Title: Adopt Resolution Requesting that the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Adopt Annual Parcel Assessments for the County’s Watershed Program.

Recommendation of the County Administrator Recommendation of Board Committee

RECOMMENDATIONS:

ADOPT Resolution establishing a rate of \$30 per Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for Stormwater Utility Area 17 (Unincorporated County) for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 and requesting that the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (FC District) adopt annual parcel assessments for drainage maintenance and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Program, Countywide.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The 2026-2027 rate per ERU is the same as that set for fiscal year 2025-2026. Therefore, there will be no change in rate for Unincorporated County property owners. The unincorporated area of Contra Costa County will produce approximately \$3,679,595 which will be used to implement the Unincorporated County’s Stormwater Program. All associated costs funded 100% by Stormwater Utility Area 17 Funds. Project No. 7517-6W7091

BACKGROUND:

The Clean Water Program consists of the County, Contra Costa cities, and the FC District working together to prevent, reduce, or eliminate the discharge of pollutants into the storm drain system, including creeks and other natural waterways. The Clean Water Program was established in response to changes in the Federal Clean Water Act. The Clean Water permitting program is known as the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program. To be in compliance with the current Municipal Regional Stormwater NPDES Permit (MRP), Clean Water Program participants implement stormwater programs to comply with the provisions outlined in the MRP. These stormwater programs are paid for with stormwater utility fee

assessments. Adoption of the attached resolution will begin the annual process of assessment adoption.

The Board of Supervisors is being asked to set a rate of \$30 for one ERU in the Unincorporated County areas and to request that the FC District adopt the stormwater utility assessment. (The FC District is the only entity under state law with legal authority to assess this particular assessment.)

The Public Works Department administers the County Stormwater Program. Examples of how the assessment is being spent in the current year include:

1. Work with County Building Inspection and Public Works inspectors and construction companies/contractors to reduce construction contaminants, such as paint, cement, oil/fuels, and soil erosion from entering storm drains and creeks.
2. Encourage Planners and the development community to use new designs that will reduce contaminated stormwater runoff.
3. Educate the public on the benefits of reducing pesticides and other toxic household product use and their proper disposal.
4. Educate County Engineers and Maintenance staff on flood control design, construction, and maintenance practices that protect water quality and preserve natural watershed habitats.
5. Inspect industrial and commercial businesses for evidence that spill prevention, equipment maintenance and cleaning, waste handling and disposal, and other business practices are done in a manner that minimizes stormwater contamination.
6. Educate marina operators and their marina users through a marina program.
7. Implement trash reduction control measures.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If the rate per ERU is not set for the coming fiscal year, funds will not be available for the County's Watershed Program to comply with the MRP. The San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board has the authority to issue fines of up to \$10,000 per day against those municipalities that do not comply with the MRP and fail to implement the stormwater programs in compliance with the MRP provisions.

ASSESSMENT FOR DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE AND THE NATIONAL

WHEREAS, under Federal Water Pollution Control Act, prescribed discharges of stormwater require a permit from the appropriate California regional water quality board under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakley (City) did apply for, and did receive, an NPDES permit which requires the implementation of selected Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from entering storm waters; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City to utilize funds received from its Stormwater Utility Area (SUA) for implementation of the NPDES program and drainage maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the City, the Contra Costa County Flood Control & Water Conservation District (District) has completed the process for formation of an SUA, including the adoption of the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, The SUA and Program Group Costs Payment agreement between City and District requires that the City annually, by May 1st, determine the rate to be assessed to a single Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for the forthcoming fiscal year.

BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Oakley has determined that the rate to be assigned to a single ERU for FY 2026/27 shall be set at \$30.00. The City Council does hereby request the District to adopt SUA levies based on said amount is approved.
