**4. REVIEW AND APPROVE PRIOR MEETING RECORD OF ACTIONS**

- The issue of “unauthorized” dumping of potentially toxic bark and wood chips at several public roadside locations resurfaced briefly.
- Chris Chapman was present and was credited with providing exclusively “clean” wood chips to the entry/egress ramps onto Rt. 680.
- There continues to be a repeat offender described as driving a white truck and dumping trash in public access zones, typically between 6:50 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- Lt. Dickerson indicated that he will coordinate the positioning of deputy personnel to address the issue.
- Community members who observe inappropriate trash dumping are encouraged to call 925-646-2441 or dial 911.

**5. POLICE REPORT**

- Deputy Fisher presented a comprehensive report of February activities, including 447 calls for service, 15 school security checks, and one arrest.
- Deputy Fisher was commended for his consistent and friendly presence at local schools. His regular engagement has fostered a positive relationship between law enforcement and students.
- Deputy Fisher was also recognized for coordinating investigative efforts involving witness descriptions, Flock camera data, and multi-county deputy communication. This collaboration resulted in the identification, tracking, and arrest of two suspects connected to multiple incidents involving the accosting and robbery of local residents. Both suspects have been taken into custody; one was already wearing an ankle monitoring device at the time of arrest.
