35			by Measure X, to ensure it conforms to (i) the stated intent of the ballot measure,
36			and (ii) the Board's direction for specific allocations.

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43		The Committee's role is to advise the Board on these matters, and it shall be staffed by	
44		the County Administrator's Office. The Committee will not make any funding	
45		recom	mendations.
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1	V.	MEMBERSHIP
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3		The Committee is comprised of five members, one from each Supervisorial district.
4		Each Supervisor will appoint one member, who will serve at the pleasure of the Board
5		of Supervisors. The appointment will run in alignment with the term of office of the
6		appointing Supervisor.

10		When a vacancy occurs, the Supervisor represented by the vacant seat may appoint

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27	VII.	TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP
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29		If a member of the Committee ceases to meet the membership requirements of Article
30 31		VI of these bylaws, their membership will automatically terminate.
32		If a member of the Committee fails to participate in any regular scheduled meeting
33		without an excused absence, it will be grounds for the County Administrator to
34		recommend to the Board that it rescind the absentee member's appointment. Excused
35		absences will be granted for the following reasons: illness of self, member of immediate
36		family, or close friend; death of member of immediate family or close friend;
37		requirements of the member's job; vacation. A member must contact the County
38		Administrator prior to the meeting to be excused from a meeting.
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40		Before making a recommendation of rescission to the Board, the County
41		Administrator will notify any member whose appointment is at risk and the
42		Supervisor who appointed the member.
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44		Resignations must be in writing and filed with the Clerk of the Board with a copy to the
45		County Administrator.
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1 2	VIII.	OPEN MEETINGS AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST	
2 3 4 5		Committee meetings must be open to the public in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act, (Gov. Code 54950 <i>et seq.</i>) and the Contra Costa County Better Government Ordinance. Committee members must adhere to the principles and rules of the Political	
6		Reform Act of 1974 (Gov. Code 81000 et seq.).	
7 8 9	IX.	OFFICERS	
10 11 12		A. The Committee shall elect its own Chair and Vice Chair. The County Administrator will be the Secretary.

The Chair shall (i) preside at all meetings of the Committee, (ii) set the agenda and review the record of action for all meetings in consultation with the Secretary, (iii) have general supervision over all Committee business and (iv) have such other powers and duties as may be assigned by the Committee, provided such powers and duties are consistent with these bylaws.	
19 20 21 22 23 24		C. The Vice Chair shall, in the absence or inability of the Chair to act, exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall also have such other powers and duties as may be assigned by the Committee, provided such powers and duties are consistent with these bylaws.	
25 26 27 28 29 30 31		D. The Secretary will keep the record of action for the meetings of the Committee. In consultation with the Chair, the Secretary shall prepare all agendas. The Secretary shall distribute all agendas, act as custodian of Committee records, keep a register of the contact information of each member, which information is to be furnished to the Secretary by each member and, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary.	
32 33 34 35 36		E. The Chair and Vice Chair shall be elected annually at the last regular meeting held in a calendar year. The Chair and Vice Chair will serve for a term of one year and may succeed themselves for one additional consecutive term. Officer vacancies are to be filled by election at the next regular meeting.

 38 39 40 41 42 43 		A. The Committee shall hold regular meetings quarterly during the initial year. Thereafter, the Committee shall hold regular meetings semi-annually, on a schedule to be mutually determined by the Chair and County Administrator. Ninety-six hours' notice must be given for all regular meetings.	
44 45 46		B. A special meeting may be called as needed by the Chair or by a majority of the Committee.	

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1		C. A quorum for all meetings is three members.
2 3 4 5 6 7 8		D. The agenda and record of action of each meeting is to be sent electronically to each member, the Board of Supervisors, and any additional persons authorized by the Committee. A paper copy of the agenda and minutes of each meeting will be mailed upon request. Other persons requesting the minutes of a meeting must do so in writing to the Secretary and pay the prevailing copying and mailing rates.

11 12 13 14		A. An affirmative vote of the majority of all members of the Committee present at the time is necessary to approve any action item before the Committee. If requested by any member present, a roll call vote must be held.
14 15 16		B. Proxy voting is not permitted.
10 17 18	XII.	CONDUCT OF BUSINESS
19 20 21 22 23		A. Only business that is clearly identified as an item of discussion on the publicly-posted meeting agenda may be transacted at a meeting of the Committee, except as permitted under the Ralph M. Brown Act and Contra Costa County Better Governance Ordinance.

All meetings of the Committee are to be called to order by the Chair, or in the Chair's absence, by the Vice Chair, or in the Vice Chair's absence, by a member designated for that purpose by the Chair or Vice Chair. In the absence of any such designation, the Committee may designate an acting chair by majority vote.
29 30		C. Public comment at all meetings is to be permitted in accordance with applicable law.
31 32 33	XIII.	AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS
34 35 36 37 38		A. Only the Board may amend these bylaws. A recommendation to the Board that these bylaws be amended must be approved by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members. No amendment to these bylaws is effective until it has been reviewed by County Counsel and approved by the Board.
39 40 41 42 43 44 45		B. Any proposed amendment to these bylaws is to be presented in writing at a regular meeting of the Committee for discussion. The Committee shall vote on the proposed amendment at the next regular meeting of the Committee. The agenda for such meeting is to contain an item entitled "Proposed Bylaws Amendment."

1 XIV. DISSOLUTION 2

The Board shall dissolve the Committee after all tax revenue collected pursuant to
 Measure X is considered expended, and a final report is submitted.
