I'm experienced in working with local, state, and federal partners including elected officials to deliver tangible benefits to the most vulnerable communities. I have experience in building technical and regulatory capacity for the regulated community and local regulators to ensure environmental compliance. I have experience in providing training and outreach to the most affected communities by environmental pollution. I strongly believe that I have right experience and knowledge to successfully carry out the duties of a HM commissioner.

In my position with the US EPA Environmental Justice program in 2010s, I have collaborated with Contra Costa Health's Environmental Health Program, Supervisor Gioia's office, and the hazardous materials ombudsman at CC Environmental Health in delivering federal funding and resources to the Environmental Justice communities in Richmond and Concord (Monument Corridor). I am a proud mother of two college students who were born and raised in this county. My son is an Eagle Scout and my daughter is on a full merit based scholarship at a top 20 university. I taught them the importance of volunteerism and community service. I was on the board of the parent faculty club at my children's middle school and frequently volunteered at the Contra Costa and Solano County Food Bank as a member of a mother-daughter service organization based in Walnut Creek. The food distribution activities with the food bank led me to the areas of the county that are most in need. I treasure the opportunities to serve those residents and to connect with them, especially around the holidays.
